PHQ RESUMED FUNCTIONING AT SRINAGAR DGP STRESSES FOR BETTER POLICING

Jammu & Kashmir Police
Headquarters and other darbar

functioning at Srinagar following the
Annual Durbar Move on May 09,
2011. Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP
J&K inspected various moving
police establishments including
(PHQ). Armed, Security, Crime, CID,
Railway and Traffic Headquarters.

The DGP was received at PHQ lawns by senior police officers and was presented a guard of honour by a smartly attired contingent of Armed Police. The DGP visited various sections of PHQ and enquired from the officers and officials about the working of their sections. He stressed upon them to work with zeal, dedication and discipline.

Later the DGP chaired a high level meeting of heads of all wings of police organization at PHQ to discuss security scenario and law and order situation in the State. He expressed satisfaction over the law and order situation and emphasized for restoring peace and development with the cooperation of people across the State.

"The elements, inimical to peace, should be isolated by making the people aware about their ill designs. Our focus should be to ensure peace in the State which is essential for education and developmental activities. The men in khaki have to ignore their personnel comforts and ensure peaceful atmosphere so that the people feel safe and secure," the DGP said.

He stressed upon the officers present in the meeting to maintain high alert despite dipping graph of militancy related incidents. Referring to the activities taken by the department under its Civic Action Programme, the DGP said that the

activities would continue across the State. He said that in view of the growing populace in the summer capital, the organization has realized need for more sports stadia and is approaching the authorities to identify a proper space in the city which could be developed as stadium for the youth.

He reiterated that the best singers recognized during recent singing talent hunt organized by the department at various levels across the state, would be sent to Mumbai to refine their talent further so that they could bring laurels for the State.

... He hoped that the efforts of the Police Organization would yield good results and the youth would prove their talent in the fields of education, science, sports, cultural and other activities for their bright future.



He said that the force taking militancy as a challenge, gave supreme

sacrifices of its jawans and officers to bring peace and normalcy in the state. He also stressed upon the pass outs to devote themselves for the service of the society and work for the integrity of the nation and keep the flag of the Organization afloat. People of the State have great expectations from the men in khaki and service of the society should be our priority, the DGP Added. He asked the jawans that after completing their training they would be deployed in different fields and they have to prove themselves public friendly by exhibiting their discipline and impartiality.

The trainees have undergone a rigorous basic training course, besides they have been imparted training in different fields of policing which include use of lethal/non lethal weapons, crowd

controll by using minimum force, VIP security, Crime detection, Map reading and human rights protection. While imparting training professional needs of police force in the present times have been kept in mind. Among the various wings of police viz. Executive, Armed and IR, 21 are postgraduates and 337 graduates.

Shri Kuldeep Khoda, IPS disclosed that STC Talwara has so far trained more then 9,000 jawans of J&K Police, since its establishment besides having imparted training to civil defence volunteers and forest protection force. A civil defence volunteer camp was organized in the Centre for better exposure to the trainees in disaster management and rescue operations. Special attention was focused on inculcating a sense of reasoning among the trainees.

Earlier in his welcome address, Shri K Rajendra IPS the Additional Director General of Police, Armed\Law & Order J&K, said that the trainees also came with laurels for the Organization when they were deputed for maintaining law and order in the valley and despite odd situations they performed

Jenab Omar Abdullah, Hon'ble Chief Minister, of Jammu and Kashmir visited Sher-i-Kashmir Police Academy Udhampur on April 21, 2011. During the visit, Hon'ble CM interacted with the newly appointed Probationary Deputy Superintendents of Police and Sub Inspectors of Police undergoing basic training at the academy. He laid the foundation stone of indoor block, besides delivering valedictory address on the conclusion of two days State level workshop on Juvenile Justice System which commenced on 20-4-2011. He keenly observed outdoor training activities of fresh recruits.

Sh. Kuldeep Khoda, IPS, Director General of Police, Jammu & Kashmir and Sh. Ashok K. Gupta, IPS, Director SKPA Udhampur accompanied the Chief Minister, during the visit. Shri Kuldeep Khoda, IPS, DGP J&K during his address to the participants in the workshop impressed upon the police officers to upgrade their methodology in dealing with vulnerable children who come in conflict with law.

There is a need to upgrade J&K Juvenile Justice Act 1997 at par with national legislation viz Juvenile Justice Act 2000 to incorporate relevant provisions for care and protection of the children Hon'ble CM said. He hoped that this will form part of the basic training of police officers.

Shri Omar Abdullah, Hon'ble Chief Minister while addressing the participants stressed upon the police officers to be sensitive while dealing with children who need care and protection. He exhorted all the police officers of the state to proactively associate with the community so that such vulnerable sections of society do not get exploited and their future is not marred. He directed DGP J&K to appoint child welfare officers in each police station who should be sensitized to involve parents and members of civil society in dealing abandoned with neglected / children, or who are victims of abuse, violence or exploitation. Police should ensure that children who come in conflict with law are dealt more humanely.



J&K POLICE TO PURCHASE VDS FOR VIP SECURITY

Jammu and Kashmir Police is purchasing Vibration Detection System (VDS) to upgrade the security setup of VVIP and important installations in Jammu and Kashmir.

The police has floated tenders recently to purchase VDS for the security and safety of VVIP areas and important installations in the state.

J&K police will purchase 7000 meters of VDS to ensure security. VDS has to be able to detect intrusion attempts made to "break-through" the wall or cut and climb through the fence of site.

The VDS will have no moving parts, which is a common source of false alarms in most system. VDS will be electrical components based only. The system will provide an alarm detection resolution for not more than 5 minutes, "The VDS and sensitivity of each of its sensor will be set through the computer using system software to adjust and suit new site conditions."

The system communication will work both wired and wireless independently and concurrently, "the communication card will be flexible enough to programme it with text message that are received in the Control Panel and Central Control System.

Traffic police, Kashmir paid tribute to Selection Grade Constable Altaf Hussain 1266/Aux who laid down his life in service of the nation while performing his duties at Polo View crossing Srinagar.
