PHQ RESUMED FUNCTIONING AT SRINAGAR DGP STRESSES FOR BETTER POLICING

Railway and Traffic Headquarters.

The DGP was received at PHQ lawns by senior police officers and was presented a guard of honour by a smartly attired contingent of Armed Police. The DGP visited various sections of PHQ and enquired from the officers and officials about the working of their sections. He stressed upon them to work with zeal, dedication and discipline.

Later the DGP chaired a high level meeting of heads of all wings of police organization at PHQ to discuss security scenario and law and order situation in the State. He expressed satisfaction over the law and order situation and emphasized for restoring peace and development with the cooperation of people across the State.

"The elements, inimical to peace, should be isolated by making the people aware about their ill designs. Our focus should be to ensure peace in the State which is essential for education and developmental activities. The men in khaki have to ignore their personnel comforts and ensure peaceful atmosphere so that the people feel safe and secure," the DGP said.

He stressed upon the officers present in the meeting to maintain high alert despite dipping graph of militancy related incidents. Referring to the activities taken by the department under its Civic Action Programme, the DGP said that the

activities would continue across the State. He said that in view of the growing populace in the summer capital, the organization has realized need for more sports stadia and is approaching the authorities to identify a proper space in the city which could be developed as stadium for the youth.

He reiterated that the best singers recognized during recent singing talent hunt organized by the department at various levels across the state, would be sent to Mumbai to refine their talent further so that they could bring laurels for the State.

He hoped that the efforts of the Police Organization would yield good results and the youth would prove their talent in the fields of education, science, sports, cultural and other activities for their bright future.

Shri Nasir Aslam Wani Hon'ble MoS Home J&K held a meeting with the top brass of J&K Police at Police Headquarters Jammu on April 27, 2011. The department has stood at par with the premier police agencies of the country and we are focusing on making Jammu & Kashmir Police a model police force in the country.



He said that the force taking militancy as a challenge, gave supreme

sacrifices of its jawans and officers to bring peace and normalcy in the state. He also stressed upon the pass outs to devote themselves for the service of the society and work for the integrity of the nation and keep the flag of the Organization afloat. The trainees have undergone a rigorous basic training course, besides they have been imparted training in different fields of policing which include use of lethal/non lethal weapons, crowd

controll by using minimum force, VIP security, Crime detection, Map reading and human rights protection. While imparting training professional needs of police force in the present times have been kept in mind. Among the various wings of police viz. Executive, Armed and IR, 21 are postgraduates and 337 graduates.

Shri Kuldeep Khoda, IPS disclosed that STC Talwara has so far trained more then 9,000 jawans of J&K Police, since its establishment besides having imparted training to civil defence volunteers and forest protection force. A civil defence volunteer camp was organized in the Centre for better exposure to the trainees in disaster management and rescue operations. Special attention was focused on inculcating a sense of reasoning among the trainees.

Earlier in his welcome address, Shri K Rajendra IPS the Additional Director General of Police, Armed\Law & Order J&K, said that the trainees also came with laurels for the Organization when they were deputed for maintaining law and order in the valley and despite odd situations they performed

well. He said that the trainees have been imparted training covering all aspects of policing and special lecturers have been organized on protection of human rights and better police public relations.

Constable Javaid Ahmed, Who was declared all round best on the occasion, was granted out of turn promotion and was decorated with the rank of Sgct by DGP on the spot. Constable Imtiyaz Ahmed, Arun Verma, Deepak Pancha, Shabir Hussain and Himat Sharma were also honoured with commendation certificates and cash rewards for their good performance during the training.
