Shri Kuldeep Khoda, ADGP (Armed) declared the Meet open at Police Stadium, Gulshan Ground, Jammu on March 15. The conference was a vital forum of its own kind that had the participation from various ranks in which important issues concerning the Police Telecommunication in J&K including its functioning and implications of technological innovations were deliberated upon and discussed.

He assured the participants of improving the facilities and working conditions at various telecommunication centers, which included renovation of telecommunication buildings, provision of light vehicles at district headquarters and installation of computers at District Police Radio Offices for office automation etc.

About 100 Police officers, mostly investigating officers, attended the said workshop. Dr. R.L. Dhar, Director FSL and other forensic experts delivered lectures on various aspects of forensic science and demonstrated the application of latest forensic techniques. These included resuscitation of metallic surface; gun shot residual analysis, use of trace metal detection and electrostatic developer for lifting of footprints, spectroscopy for the identification of inks etc. Shri S.M. Sahai, DIG Poonch- Rajouri Range, inaugurated the workshop. District Superintendents of Police, Poonch and Rajouri were also present on the inaugural session of the workshop.

Another workshop for I.O's was held at Jammu in collaboration with Vigilance organization. 20 investigating officers of vigilance organization participated in the workshop. Lectures were delivered on examination of questioned documents including judicial papers, revenue records, counterfeit currency notes, bank drafts etc.
