An Attestation-cum-passing out parade of 35 probationary Sub Inspectors including 17 woman officers was held at Sher-i-Kashmir Police Academy, Udhampur on April 27, 2007.

Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister, J&K, who was the Chief Guest on the occasion, inspected the parade and took salute at an impressive march-past.

Addressing the gathering of senior civil, police officers and trainees on the occasion, Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K, while lauding the role of J&K Police in maintaining law and order under the most difficult and trying circumstances, said that, in the days ahead, J&K Police had a bigger role in the task of restoring complete normalcy. The state Police. being well conversant with the prevailing ground situation, were competent enough to shoulder the responsibility, the Chief Minister added, Hon'ble C.M expressed hope that peace process would gain momentum as the people of the state were yearning for peace and development. In the fast changing scenario, the police had to act as catalyst for creating conducive conditions so that every citizen of the state would live and work without fear, with rights protected and secured,
