Shri P.S.Gill, ADGP, Armed J&K, inaugurated the vertical interaction programme for J&K Armed Police officers on August 30.

In his introductory address, the ADGP, Armed dwelt on basic qualities that were required to make a successful Police officer, which included high sense of devotion, self-oriented leadership, initiative, integrity and positive attitudes, accompanied by professional competence. He gave the participants a few tips for raising the level of motivation, essential for achieving organizational excellence, which included identifying and communicating required new behaviours, identifying preferred reinforcers, leveraging peer

pressure, follow up of directions, intermittent rewarding and helping employees to relive success. On the essence of holding the vertical interaction programmes for J&K Armed Police, the ADGP, Armed said that it was aimed at learning from ones own experiences and from the experiences of others, interacting with senior and junior colleagues, not just horizontally but vertically.

Shri Gopal Sharma, Director General of Police, J&K, chaired the proceedings during the valedictory session on August 31. Senior Police officers including Shri P.S Gill, Additional Director General, Armed Police chaired the session, Shri P.L.Gupta,

Shri Shiekh Owais Ahmad, IGP, Armed Police Headquarters, while summing up the proceedings of the 2-day vertical interaction programme, said that participant had shown keen interest in deliberations, which helped them in sharing each other's viewpoint. He spelled out the various suggestions and recommendations made by the participants during the 2-day vertical interaction programme.

In his valedictory address, DGP J&K, while dwelling on the practical perceptive of vertical

interaction programme, said that the programme was aimed at:

- ★ In-service and on- the- job learning— acquiring knowledge and skills ;
- ★ Developing positive attitudes amongst the members of the Force— putting forth views and accepting suggestions, becoming receptive to new ideas — changing the negative attitudes from “this can not be done” to “we have done it and we can do it”;
- ★ Providing an opportunity to participants to vibrate and communicate at ease— free exchange of ideas on various subjects— a platform to pose questions like “would it be legally right to do? Would it be not right to stop a prevailing practice?”;
- ★ Building healthy interpersonal relationship for a purposeful working relationship;
- ★ promoting participative culture; and
- ★ Recommending policy decisions based on analytical assessments on various subjects, deliberated upon and discussed during the programme.

Expressing satisfaction on the standards of performances of the J&K Armed Police and IRP battalions of the state, Shri Gopal Sharma, DGP J&K said that J&K Armed Police was acting like a catalyst in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of the Force. The active participation of J&K Armed Police was quite noticeable in every sphere of policing in the state; they could be seen performing internal security duties— deployed on area domination on high altitudes and treacherous terrains, in a highly professional manner— no less than the Army does; they were performing law and order duties, security and guard duties for protection of VIPs and important institutions, disaster management duties and actively associated in ‘anti-terrorist operations’, the DGP added.

- ★ Shri M.A. Anjum, DIG Rajouri-Poonch Range addressed a meeting of Police Community Partnership Group (PCPG) at Thannamandi (Rajouri), on August 7. About 150 persons of Thannamandi and its adjoining areas including *sarpanchs* and *Panchs* and other persons from all walks of life participated in the meeting. Shri M.A. Anjum exhorted upon the people that they should become partner of peace to ensure development and betterment of society in a positive and congenial environment, besides ensuring peace in society and eradication of other social evils. Numerous issues and problems, as were within the competence and jurisdiction of the SP, were sorted out on the spot and the rest were forwarded to other Government departments for immediate action.

- ★ Police-Public meet at Doda held on August 02. Shri Manohar Singh, SSP, Doda chaired the Meet. Transporters, members of *Beopar Mandal* and prominent citizens of the town participated in the said meeting. The problems relating to general and social crimes including issue of driving licenses to minors without any test, overloading in the passenger vehicles, eve teasing of girls and womenfolk, illegal sale of liquor and drugs in the town were highlighted by the participants. Remedial measures were initiated to mitigate the problems of the people.
