SACRIFICES OF POLICE PERSONNEL WILL BE REMEMBERED : CM

A Passing-out-parade of 900 recruit constables of executive police was held at subsidiary Training Centre, Channi Himmat (Jammu) on

July 10. Dr Farooq Abdullah, Chief Minister of J&K took the salute. Those present included Shri Bodh Raj Bali, Minister for Industries and Commerce, Shri S.S. Slathia, Minister for Sheep Husbandary, Shri Ashok Jaitly, Chief secretary, Sh. Gurbachan Jagat, DGP, and senior civil and police officers. The smartly turned out recruits marched to the tune of "Qadam Qadam Badayee Ja" and took oath, which was administered by Shri G.A.Dar, Commandant JKAP 12th Battalion, the Principal of the training centre.

Addressing the officers and Jawans, the Chief Minister said that the responsibility of protecting the lives and property of citizens lies on police and hoped that the newly inducted constables will keep up the high traditions of the police force. He complimented the recruits and trainers for imparting quality training and hoped that the new members of the force will help in steering the state out of the present difficulties. While the valiant armed forces were bravely fighting the enemy in Kargil-Drass sector, the police personnel too were making sacrifices for the integrity of the country, Chief Minister added. Dr Farooq Abdullah said that the sacrifices made by the police would always be remembered by the nation with gratitude and announced enhancement in the ex-gratia relief, to those killed

fighting militancy, from Rs. 2 lakh to 5 lakhs.

Constable Mohd Mubarik 1781/A, who was adjudged as allround-best cadet, was given one rank promotion.

The Chief Minister Dr Farooq Abdullah took salute at another passing-out-parade of 972 recruit constables of district police held at subsidiary Training Centre, Talwara (Reasi) on July 11. He also gave away the prizes and certificates of merit to the recruits for their outstanding performance in various disciplines. Constable Mohd Manzoor, who was adjudged all-round-best cadet, was honoured with one rank promotion, out-of-turn, for his excellent performance.

Dr Farooq Abdullah laid stress on regular in-service trainings at various levels so that the entire force remains physically fit and also acquires new skills and specialised training. It was announced that the Talwara Centre will be converted into Armed Police Training Centre to meet the needs of the in-service training.

NOMANI MEMORIAL LECTURE


Justice R.P. Sethi, Judge of the Supreme Court of India, delivered 6th Nomani Memorial lecture in memory of late M.A.Nomani, an IPS officer of 1965 batch, at SKICC Srinagar on July 03. Justice Sethi Spoke on "Criminal Justice System-indispensability of Police Force in its enforcement". The lecture was arranged by J&K Chapter of IIPA. The Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, was the chief guest and Mr Justice Bhawani Singh, Chief Justice of J&K High Court, presided. The audience included Judges of the High Court, Legislators, Judicial officers, Lawyers, Academicians, Students, Civil and Military officers.

Deliberating on the subject, Mr Justice R.P. Sethi observed that the most visible symbol of the state authority in the eyes of common man, having been conferred with wide ranging powers, is police and its functioning has been admitted to be the central point for protecting Human Rights and strengthening Criminal Justice System. He called for overhauling the Police Act so that police can function effectively as an organ of the welfare state committed to the rule column. Pointing to the rise in crime in the country, he said that the criminal law has ceased to be having a deterrent effect on criminals on account of long delays in disposal of cases coupled with declining rate of conviction, which has fallen to mere 6.4%.

Rich tributes were paid to Shri Nomani by the speakers who described him as a disciplined police officer with extraordinary knowledge of law who dedicated himself to the cause of justice. Family members of Shri Nomani, including Dr Mumtaz Nomani, were present on the occasion.

DGP INAUGURATES POLICE STATION BUILDING AT ARNIA

constructed at an expenditure of Rs.26 lakhs. The building comprises 4 barracks for 80 personnel, recreation-cum-dining hall, two residential quarters for lower subordinates and two residential quarters for NGOs. The Director General of Police also inaugurated Police buildings at Ramgarh, Alah, Bari Brahmana and Sainik Colony in Jammu District the same day. The buildings at the aforementioned places have been constructed at a cumulative cost of Rs.57.70 lakhs by the Police Construction Division. The DGP was accompanied by IGP Hqrs., Shri Gopal Sharma, IGP Jammu Zone, Shri Kuldeep Khoda, DIG Jammu-Kathua Range, Shri S.K. Misra and other senior Police officers.


