ACHIEVEMENTS IN ANTIMILITANCY OPERATIONS

TWELVE TERRORISTS SURRENDERED ALONGWITH ARMS & AMMUNITION

Twelve top militants alongwith arms & ammunition surrendered before Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister, J&K at Ramban on December, 22. Shri Nawang Rigzin Jora, Hon'ble Minister for Power, Shri Kuldeep Khoda, DGP J&K, Dr. S.P. Vaid, IGP Jammu Zone, Shri S.M. Sahai, IGP Kashmir Zone, Shri A D Shanaz, Deputy Commissioner Ramban and Shri Basant Rath, SP Ramban were also present on the occasion besides many other civil and police

officers. The surrendered militants include Manzoor Ahmed @ Fardan Ali S/o Ghulam Ahmed Naik R/o Dalwa, Gool, Mumtaz Ali @ Ashiq S/o Haleem Gujjar R/o Hara Gool, Abdul Qayoom S/o Abdul Rehman R/o Dagnari, Ramban, Feroz Din Malik @ Nassar Ullah S/o Mohd Abdullah R/o Muwallis Gool, Abdul Latief @ Javed Iqbal S/o Shafi Gujjar R/o Sumber, Ramban, Shakeel Ahmed @ Danish Iqbal S/o Abdul Gani R/o Sumber, Ramban, Ghulam Hussain @ Kamran S/o Noor Din R/o Sumber, Ramban, Mohd Rafi S/o Sultan R/o Bhimdassa Gool, Bashir Ahmed Gujjar S/o Abdul Rashid R/o Sumber, Ramban, Shahnawaz S/o Bahardin R/o Chapnari Banihal, Abdul Latief @ Zuber Ullah S/o Siraj Din R/o Kellar Pulwama and Riyaz Ahmed S/o Nazir Ahmed R/o Kellar, Pulwama. These militants handed over 10 AK rifles, 02 SLRs, 26 AK magazines, 02 SLR magazines, 777 AK rounds, 44 SLR rounds, 07 hand grenades, 02 IEDs and 02 wireless sets to the authorities.

While addressing the gathering, Hon'ble Chief Minister appreciated the efforts of Police and called upon the parents of the misguided youths to persuade their wards to shun the path of violence, lay down arms and join national mainstream. Hon'ble Chief Minister maintained that the State Govt. expects the number of surrendered militants to swell in the years to come and hoped that all minds are cleansed of ill will and hatred. While speaking on the occasion, Shri Kuldeep Khoda welcomed the surrender of militants as a positive development saying that government is keen to bring misguided youth in the main stream and asserted that the cultivation of police-public relations through continuous process of holding police-public interactions is yielding now notice able results.

- ⊕ One terrorist identified as Bilal Afghani (Al-Badar Commander) got killed at Arth Beerwah, Budgam on December 03 in a joint operation launched by J&K Police & CRPF. One AK rifle and one mobile phone was recovered from the slain militant.
- ⊕ One terrorist identified as Shahid (Pak national) got killed in an encounter with Police & Army at Dalpathri Cheknar, Ganderbal on December 07. One AK rifle, two magazines and one hand grenades were recovered from his possession.
- ⊕ One terrorist of LeT outfit namely Abu (Pak national) got killed in an encounter with J&K Police & Army at Harra (Gool) Ramban on December 23. One AK rifle,

03 magazines, 05 rounds and 01 hand grenade were recovered from the possession of the slain militant.

- One Dy. District Commander of HM outfit namely Nazir Ahmed Wani @ Teeli S/o Ali Mohd Wani R/o Bazgoo, Chadoora, surrendered before Police authorities at Satman Chadoora, Budgam along with 01 AK rifle, 20 rounds and 01 grenade on December 18.
- Two terrorists of JeM outfit got killed in an encounter between Police/Army and terrorists at Village Chanad Khushalpura P/S Baramulla on November 27. One of the slain terrorists has been identified as Basheer Ahmed Mir S/o Ghulam Hassan R/o Lalad Sopore. Two AK rifles were recovered from the slain militants.
- One terrorist namely Tariq Ahmed Ahanger @ Anees (PTM of HM outfit) S/o Ghulam Rasool R/o Ratnipora, Pulwama got killed in an encounter with Police/Army at Karmula Bhatnoor, Tral during the intervening night of November 25/26.

DGP CONDUCTED DARBARS AT BUDGAM, PULWAMA & ANANTNAG

He stressed that it is the prime duty of J & K Police to make lives and property of people safe and said that such atmosphere should be created by police that lives of people are made comfortable, their children receive good education and they live in fearless atmosphere. DGP stated that in its fight against the menace of militancy, Police has to ensure the safety of civilians and during encounters collateral damage has to be avoided at all costs. He said that there would be no compromise with regard to Human rights violations and human dignity has to be maintained under all circumstances. DGP urged upon the police officers and Jawans alike to put forward a humane face and bridge the gap between general public and police.

He said everyone has acknowledged the role of the state police in fight against militancy. At present, the J&K Police is considered as one of the best forces in

Shri Kuldeep Khoda, DGP, J&K who was the Chief Guest on the occasion inaugurated the Conference. In his inaugural address, DGP said that role of Jawans and officers of J&K Armed Police in anti-insurgency operations is commendable and the task of taking the terrorist head on to build constant operational pressure on them and weaken the terror infrastructure should be a regular feature with due regard to the protection of human rights and minimizing the collateral damage in the anti insurgency operations. Encouraging the men and officers of the force, DGP said that for out of turn promotions to the deserving personnel, the

Government has issued clear cut order that based on the recommendations, out of turn promotion will be granted at different level by the PHQ and that promotion issue of Inspector rank to Dy.SP, has also been projected to the Government and the Hon'ble C.M. has been magnanimous enough to agree to our proposal. Regarding enhancement of ration money, relaxation for appointment of wards of Police Martyrs under SRO-43, pay scales of ASI and HC rank, absorption of SPOs as constable in Police department, proposals have already been sent to Government and are under active consideration. The DGP envisaged the deployment of J&K Armed Police at Police station levels in future. This will also address one of the oldest demands of Armed Police personnel of getting an opportunity to serve near their home places.

Shri Owais Ahmed, IGP (Armed), J&K in his welcome address thanked the DGP and other distinguished guests for sparing their valuable time for attending the conference. The IGP threw light on the aims and objectives of the conference besides highlighting the achievements of J&K Armed Police in arena of sports, anti militancy operations, disaster management, mountaineering, protection of VIPs, protection of vital installations and , maintenance of law & order etc.
