Shri G.K. MODEL POLICE STATION INAUGURATED IN GANDHI NAGAR JAMMU

Constructed at a cost of Rs.45 Lakh within just 9 months, Model Police Station, Gandhi Nagar, Jammu, was inaugurated by Shri Omar Abdullah, Hon'ble Chief Minister, J&K on December 10, 2009.

While addressing the gathering on the inaugural function of police station, Hon'ble CM emphasized on better police-public relations asking the police to be people friendly, polite and positive under all circumstances while performing their duties. "Your behavior and attitude towards the society have greater impact in developing substantial police-public understanding and rapport necessary for maintenance of peaceful and tranquil atmosphere", Hon'ble C.M added. Appreciating the role of police in dealing with the law and order situations and restoring peace, Hon'ble CM said that J&K Police working under difficult situations have rendered commendable service in

such station is being shortly opened at Kothibagh Srinagar. Shri Kuldeep Khoda Director General of Police added.

Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K visited Rajouri and Poonch Districts on December 22 & 23, 2009.

During his visit to Rajouri, the DGP handed over a cash reward of Rs. 2.5 Lakh to Rukhsana Kousar and her brother Aijaz, who were instrumental in killing a top militant commander Abu Osama in their house on September 27, 2009. Osama carried a reward of Rs. 2.5 lakh on his head. The DGP also announced the job of constables for Rukhsana and Aijaz in Police Department.

During his visit to Poonch, the DGP held meetings with Police Operational Groups, SHOs and officers of all Wings including Traffic, CID and Wireless. While addressing the meeting, the DGP appreciated work done by Operational Groups in these districts in neutralization of large number of insurgents and capturing of huge quantity of arms and ammunition. He appreciated the synergy amongst various units of police viz. CID, District Police and

other Security forces- CRPF, BSF and Army responsible for giving severe blow to militancy and bringing peace in the area. DGP J&K also exhorted SHOs to provide congenial atmosphere to complainants and provide justice to them. During the durbar, the DGP highlighted the details of steps taken by the Government for welfare of SPOs including job of their NOKs in case

of death, preference in appointment in police and Para-Military forces. The DGP also approved a cash reward of Rs.2 lakh to a Mendhar Police team, which had killed two militants and ordered regularization of 10 Special Police Officers as constables (seven in Rajouri and 3 in Poonch) on the basis of their exceptional contribution in fight against insurgency.

Accompanied by Shri Ashok Gupta IPS IGP Jammu, Shri S.D Singh IPS DIG Rajouri-Poonch Range, Shri Manmohan Singh, SSP Poonch and Shri Shafkat Wattali IPS SSP Rajouri, the DGP inspected arms,ammunition and explosive seized by police in Poonch district.

The seizure include 21 AK Rifles, eight pistols, four pika guns, one pump action gun, one bolt action gun, 5000 AK rounds, 4 binoculars, two LPG fitted IEDs, two Thoraya satellite telephones, four wireless sets, 20 Kg explosives, 9 IEDs, 551 detonators, 20 grenades, 17 Chinese grenade, and 500 Pika rounds.

ACHIEVEMENTS ON ANTI-MILITANCY FRONT

During the month of December 2009 J&K Police killed 03 dreaded militants, apprehended 07 and managed the surrender of 02 militants besides recovery of a huge quantity of Arms and ammunition across the state. The Arms and ammunition recovered during this period include 09 AK 47/56 rifles, 12 AK magazines, 3974 AK rounds, 11 pistols, 16 pistol magazines, 191 pistol rounds, 23 hand grenades, 05 wireless sets, 01 telescope, 17 kg explosive, 51 mm high explosive, 07 UBGL grenades, 17 UBGL rounds, 03 UBGL thrower, one .303 rifle, 01 Pika Gun, 861 Pika rounds, 02 Para Bomb, 05 Detonators and 01 SLR Rifle.
