J&K POLICE FULLY GEARED TO FACE CHALLENGES OF INSURGENCY: DGP

The Director General of Police, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, in his address, on the occasion of attestation-cum-Passing-out-Parade of 116 Probationary Sub-Inspectors, 400 recruit constables

and 160 women recruit constables at Sher-e-Kashmir Police Academy, Udhampur on October 25, 1999, said that the State Police has made long strides during last few years to become self confident, strong and capable to face the challenges of insurgency. Congratulating the recruits on completion of training, Shri Gurbachan Jagat said that in the changing security scenario, the success of the police lay in anticipating the future problems well in advance and prepare to face the new challenges, whether it is insurgency or law and order. He said

that strenuous efforts are being made to modernise the police force and equip it with latest anti-terrorism techniques and methods and we are now training Armed battalions and civil police as commandos and stressing on fighting tactics and operating in difficult terrains and jungles. Hailing the liberal help from the Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah to improve the police infrastructure including transport, communication and weaponry, the DG said the 20,000 additional police personnel have been inducted into the State police and the total strength of the police is likely to

go up by another 10,000 in the coming years. The modernisation of J&K Police has been done according to an action plan formulated by the Union Home Ministry, for which we have received Rs.43 crores last year and Rs.80 crores would be released

for this year, said the DGP. The inadequate training facilities in the State have been upgraded with opening of training schools at Kathua, Manigam, Baramulla, Channi Himmat and Talwara (Reasi) to

train recruit police constables. A Police Technical Training Institute (PTTI) has been established at Vijaypur Jammu to train CID, Security and Telecommunication personnel, the DGP added. The DGP enlisted various achievements of State Police which included successful conduct of Shri Amar Nath Ji Yatra, Independence Day and Parliamentary Elections in the State.

The DGP presented trophies to various recruits who secured top positions in the training. Shri Masud Choudhary, Director of the Police Academy, gave a resume of the activities and said that the Police Academy is progressing and a number of new courses including those on computers and human rights management have been added.

POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY.

SOME ACHIEVEMENTS IN ANTI-MILITANCY OPERATIONS.

- SOG Srinagar unearthed a hawala racket by arresting Baramulla Branch Manager of J&K Bank and an employee of Srinagar Development authority. Rs. 7 lakhs were recovered from the arrested persons. The racket involved running of a conduit for Pakistan based Harkat-Ul-Mujahideen militant outfit in the valley.

CIVIC ACTION PROGRAMME – A PEOPLE FRIENDLY INITIATIVE.

Besides fighting militancy in the upper reaches of Udhampur district, J&K Police has taken onus to provide basic amenities to the people under Civic Action Programme. IR-III Bn. under the command of Dr Kamal Saini have installed taps to provide drinking water to the people, constructed bath rooms, a passenger shed and foot path for pedestrians at Sangaldan (Udhampur District). 12 Sewing Machines were distributed among the widows and 110 school uniforms provide to school going students including 43 females. The battalion is running a type-writing institute and has provided sports material to the youth of the
