GREATER ROLE FOR J&K POLICE IN ANTI-MILITANCY OPERATIONS : DGP

Reasi, on the 1st raising day of Indian Reserve (IR) 4th battalion on Jan. 02, the Director General of Police said that four battalions, deployed in Kupwara, Surankote (Poonch), Doda and Reasi (Udhampur) for anti-militancy operations, have done well in these remote areas in bringing back sense of security among the locals. Two more IR battalions sanctioned recently, recruitment for which has started, shall also be entrusted with the task of anti-militancy operations, the DGP added.

DGP inaugurated the Battalion Headquarters building, a newly constructed stadium at Subsidiary Training Centre (STC), where 1000 recruits of executive police are under-going basic training, and a blood donation camp. 53 *Jawans*, including two women constables, voluntarily donated blood on the occasion.

Shri Gopal Sharma, Inspector General of Police Headquarters, Dr Ashok Bhan, Inspector General of Armed Police, Shri Ram Lubhaya, DIG Udhampur-Doda Range, Shri D.K. Kapoor, DIG Armed Range Jammu, Shri A.K. Chowdhry, SSP Udhampur, Shri Satvir Gupta, Commandant IR IVth Bn. and a large number of prominent citizens were present on the occasion. A friendly tug-of-war competition between staff and trainees was also held.

In his welcome address, the Inspector General of Armed Police said that Police personnel were doing an excellent job in tough and treacherous terrains under difficult circumstances and the morale of the force, was high. Inspector General of Armed Police added that Armed Police battalions have started showing encouraging results and in the coming days, the battalions will continue to associate fully with STF and *thana* Police in the maintenance of law and order in the State.

After his engagements at Reasi and Talwara, the Director General of Police, accompanied by Inspector General of Armed Police and Commandant IR 4th Bn., visited Chachwa and Khanikote in the upper reaches of Arnas and Reasi, where they spent some time with the *Jawans* posted on these pickets.

J&K POLICE HOUSING CORPORATION

J&K Police Housing Corporation has taken up construction of an administrative block in Gulshan Ground Complex for use by officers of Armed Police, Homeguards/Civil Defence, Tele-communication wing etc. The foundation stone of the Rs. 3.23 Crore project was laid by DGP J&K, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, on January 01. Shri Madan Lal, Managing Director of the Corporation and other senior officers were present on the occasion.

The Corporation, which has moved into its new office at Narwal, has also finalized construction of 1517 family quarters throughout the state at an estimated cost of Rs 28 Crores. The projects in hand with the Corporation include construction of Kashmir Police Office Complex at Srinagar, Police Station buildings at Nigeen, Rainawari, Channi Himmat, Trikutanagar and Marwah and building for Central Stores-cum-Divisional Office of the Corporation at Gulshan Ground Jammu. Jails, Fire Services department and Homeguards/Civil Defence organisation have also entrusted construction of their buildings to the Corporation.

ELECTRONIC EXCHANGE COMMISSIONED AT CHANNI HIMMAT POLICE COMPLEX

A 64-port Electronic Exchange was inaugurated by Shri Rajan Bakhshi, Inspector General of Police (Modernisation) on Jan. 07 at Police Complex, Channi Himmat. This exchange has been linked with PCR through MART and also with Channi Himmat Civil Exchange through a tie-line.

The communication network of Traffic Police Jammu and Srinagar has been renovated and brought on VHF channel of Motorola equipment by replacing the old equipment.

BIG HAUL OF EXPLOSIVES

On Jan 20, Hiranagar Police recovered a big cache of explosives, weapons and ammunition which were concealed in gunny bags, near village Jatwal in Kathua District. The recoveries included 20 Kgs. of RDX, 2 pistols, 281 rounds of A.K. weapons, 3 magazines, 122 pistol rounds, one wireless set, 8 Panasonic batteries, 10 detonators, 2 bundles of fusewire and 5 timer devices.

FOREIGN MERCENARY ELIMINATED BY SPECIAL OPERATIONS GROUP SRINAGAR

A dreaded foreign mercenary, identified as Saifullah Code-name Hafat of NWFP, Pakistan, belonging to Harkat-ul-Mujahideen outfit, was killed in an encounter in Pattan area by Special Operations Group of J&K Police on Jan 17. One AK-56

rifle, two magazines, 20 rounds and one wireless set were recovered from the site of encounter. The slain mercenary was operating in Kashmir Valley as Deputy Chief of his organisation and was involved in a large number of innocent killings. Saifullah's death has come as a major jolt for Harkat-ul-Mujahideen.

COUNTER-INSURGENCY OPERATIONS ALONG J&K HIMACHAL BORDER

Pickets of special task force (STF) of Jammu & Kashmir Police and Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) have been set up

in areas along the J&K border with Himachal Pradesh for counter-insurgency operations. Director General of Police, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, paid a visit to some of these pickets on Jan 5 to take stock of the situation along the J&K-HP border. Some village Defence Committees (VDCs) have also been formed in the area to assist the security forces. These operational pickets are in constant touch with the CRPF, ITBP and Chamba Police through a well established wireless network.

SOG DODA SMASHES HIDEOUTS

In a search operation, launched by SOG Doda in Gandoh area of Doda District on Jan 11, three hideouts of the militants were destroyed at Ludoo, Kansar and Rajpora areas. The hideouts were built underground and a large quantity of ration items, clothing and other consumable items were recovered from the hideouts.

KZF MILITANT NABBED BY JAMMU POLICE

A top militant of Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF), identified as Naseeb Singh, hailing from Digiana area of Jammu, was arrested by a naka party of Kathua Police on Jammu-Pathankot National Highway on Jan 23. A pistol was recovered from his possession. The arrested militant was in hiding for the last over two years to evade his arrest.
