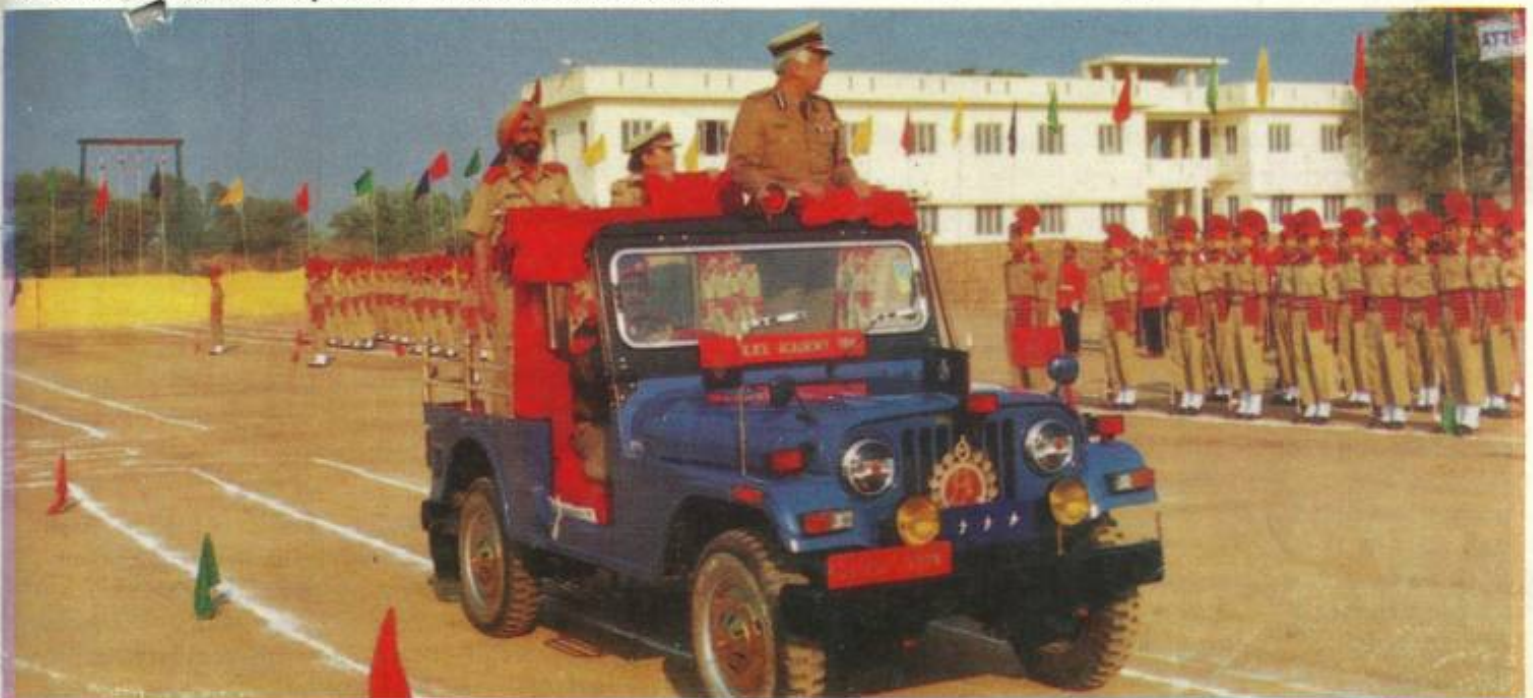

### RAISING DAY OF POLICE TECHNICAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (PTTI) VIJAYPUR

Police Technical Training Institute, Vijaypur (Jammu) set up to impart training to Police Personnel in intelligence, security, telecommunication, Photography and other technical areas related to policing, celebrated its Raising Day on Jan. 03. The passing out cum attestation parade of 135 trainees of drivers/motor mechanics synchronised with the said function. Shri Gurbachan Jagat, DGP, J&K, who was the Chief Guest, took the salute at a colourful parade. A galaxy of Police officers including Shri Rajan Bakshi, ADGP, HQrs, J&K, Shri Gopal Sharma, ADGP, Armed, Shri P.S. Gill, IGP, Modernisation and Sh. M.S. Wani, IGP, Traffic also attended the said function.

The Director General of Police, J&K in his address to Officers and *Jawans*, expressed satisfaction over the func-

tioning of the Institute and said that there was need for upgrading the Institute including opening of a Research and Development (R&D) Cell for Forensic Science, for which ADGP Hqrs. and IGP, Modernisation, were asked to take initiatives. The DGP impressed upon the trainees to shoulder the responsibilities with firm resolve, dedication and devotion. He reminded the jawans that terrorism, which is being exported by the enemy to subvert the integrity of the state and also to create disorder and chaotic conditions in the country, has to be fought collectively and every individual Policeman has to contribute in eradicating this menace. ## OUT OF TURN PROMOTIONS :

out of turn as SI, HC and SG Constable respectively on Jan. 22, 2000 in recognition of their extra-ordinary alertness, dedication and devotion to duty which led to the recovery of a cache of weapons, ammunition and explosives meant for subversion in Jammu city.

## SOME LANDMARKS

**Ashok Chakra for Police :** Police personnel as a class were hitherto ineligible for Ashok/Kirti/Shaurya Chakra even though these could be awarded to civilians. The statues of Ashok Chakra series of medals have been amended vide Rashtrapati Bhawan Notification No. 94-pers/99 dated 24-06-99 to include CPMF and police personnel (including RPF) in the eligible category.

**National flag in Police Funerals :** Hitherto use of National flag was not permitted in the funeral of police martyrs even though martyrdom had been attained with defence personnel. The same action and national flag was used in state and military funeral. This aberration has been removed vide MHA letter No. 15/17/98 public dated 23-6-99 which has amended the flag code India to allow use of National flag also in para military funerals besides states and military funerals.

**Gallantry Medal Allowances :** A time study revealed that Monetary Allowance of defence and Police gallantry Medals used to be revised simultaneously in equal proportion and certain relativity obtained between the two up to 1982. Thereafter this relativity was lost as Allowances for Defence Medals alone were increased a number of times-twice after the 5th CPC. The matter was taken up with the MHA, who in terms of Order No. 11026/10/98-PMA dated 6-12-99 have increased these amounts to Rs. 750 and Rs. 450.

**Certificate for Police Medals :** Government of India has finally agreed that recipients of President's Police Medal of Gallantry / Distinguished / Meritorious service awarded wef 1-1-99 will now get a scroll signed by the President of India in line with recipients of Defence Medals. The specimen of the certificate has been circulated vide MHA letter No. 1/019/97-PMA dated 8th Feb.



## DRIVE AGAINST MENACE OF DRUG TRAFFICKING

- City Police Jammu recovered 8 kgs. of charas from a Hotel in Talab Khatikan area on Jan. 23. The drug peddler identified as Bashir Ahmed was arrested.
- On Jan 24 a special Naka party of Udhampur Police intercepted a passenger bus at Jakheni, on the outer skirts of Udhampur town and recovered 35 kgs. of charas which had been hidden under the drivers seat. Mohd Ramzan a resident of Anantnag the driver of the Bus was arrested.

## MAJOR SUCCESSES IN ANTI-MILITANCY IN JANUARY 2000

- Border Police Jammu recovered 3 solar ignited Chinese made rockets from Gole Panjpeer Area on Jan 3. Subsequently a number of such rockets were recovered by Jammu Police from Tawi area, between Bhagwati Nagar and MAM Stadium. These rockets had been smuggled by the ISI saboteurs to trigger explosions in the crowded areas of the city.

- Two hardcore militants were killed in a joint operation by Special Operation Group (SOG), Pulwama and BSF in Tral area on Jan 15. A catch of weapons and ammunitions and also the ration items etc. were recovered from the hideout of the militants.
- Two foreign mercenaries were eliminated in an operation jointly launched by Special Operation Group (SOG) Kulgam and Rashtrya Rifles (RR) at village Arwini (Anantnag) on Jan 19.
- A dreaded foreign mercenary identified as Imran S.o Tufail of Kotli-Samba in Pakistan, was killed in the forests of Marmat (Udhampur) on Jan 19, in an encounter between the militant and Latti (Udhampur) Police.
- Two hardcore militants of HUM outfit identified as Abdul Rashid and Kamran were arrested by Jammu Police on Jan 22.
- A militant was killed by SOG Srinagar in an encounter at Rangpora (Zakoora) in Gandherbal area on Jan. 23.

- SOG Baramulla and BSF in a joint raid eliminated two militants including a Chief Coordinator of Militant Outfits in Bandipur area on Jan 23.
- SOG Kupwara and RR 21st Bn. in a joint operation, eliminated four militants in an encounter at Rajwar (Handwara) on Jan 23.
- Two foreign mercenaries identified as Mohd. Aslam and Mohd. Younis, both hailing from POK were killed in Tawi area by Jammu Police when the militants hurled a grenade on the Police Party accompanying them on a recovery mission on Jan 23.
