

Combating Terrorist Activities

The Year 2000 saw the entire J&K Police contributing in the fight against militancy, now spearheaded by foreign mercenaries. The Special Operation Groups (SOGs) and the Police Stations were able to generate intelligence, leading to a large number of successful operations either independently or with the help of security forces and para-military forces. The special operation groups (SOGs) of J&K Police, the bulwark in anti-militancy operations, proved their mettle and emerged as a robust and potent instrument of the security grid of the state. The success rate of J&K police in anti-militancy operations can be judged by the fact that the recoveries made by the J&K police constitute nearly 40% of the total recoveries made by all forces. J&K Police took the lead in targeting the top terrorists of various outfits during the year and in consequence, H.M, L.E.T, J-e-M and Al-Bader outfits suffered heavy casualities. A record number of 279 foreign mercenaries were eliminated during the year in Kashmir valley alone.








In brief

Those eliminated included Yousuf Talha, a Pak national and Divisional Comander of Lashker-e-toiba (LeT), Ghulam Mohi-ud-Din Najar, Organiser, LeT, Hamid Gadda @ Bambar Khan, Divisional Commander Hizbul Mujahideen (HM, Ghulam Mohammad, Kupwara District chief of HM, Mohammad Magbool, Divisional Commander, Tehrik-ul-Mujahideen, (TUM), Niyaz Ahmed, Chief of Islamic Front, Mansoor, a Pak national and Launching Chief, of HUM, Fayaz Ahmed @ Nasir, Launching Chief, HM, Mehraj-ud-din, Hafiz @ Feroz, Chief TUM.
- * Jammu Police successfully worked out the bomb explosions that had occurred in Sealdah and Pooja Expresses, a video coach in Punjab, Bus stand and Subzi Mandi in Jammu by arresting militants of Khalistan Zindabad Force and Islamic Front.
- * Infiltration attempts were foiled by the Police along the International Border and a number of militants Killed in encounters along it.



Explosives recovered by Kathua Police in April, 2000




Last Journey of Martyr Mohd. Altaf, Late Inspector, on 13-08-2000









Initiatives

During the year 2000, 3647 posts were filled up and added to the force. Two more IR Battalions have been sanctioned and the process of recruitment of these battalions (IR VII & VIII) has been started and is nearing completion. Further, 37 new Police Stations were sanctioned by the Government, which have been established and made functional.

High Agenda

- * With the sole agenda of bringing about greater efficiency and productivity as well as to keep-up the morale of the Police personnel, thoughtfully devised welfare schemes are being carefully implemented. In this context, during the year 2000, a number of special steps were taken, which included:-
- * Increasing the special welfare relief in the eventuality of death of a serving Police person to Rs. 4 lacs from the existing scale of Rs. 2 lacs. This is a wholly contributory fund and perhaps the only one in the country where such a high amount of relief is given with a minimal premium.
- Upgrading Police Public Schools at Jammu and Srinagar.
- * Enhancement of powers of District and Unit Welfare Committees to sanction welfare relief.
- * Follow-up of the proposal for enhancement of Ration money amount to Rs. 450 per month from Rs. 300. (The proposal has been accepted by the Government)
- * Adoption of the children of Police martyrs and their admission in good institutions.

Building Works

Pursuing the continuous agenda of improving policing and operational escacy, various new initiatives were taken in the year 2000 to enhance the communication cover, mobility and to upgrade weaponry and security equipment.

The J&K Police Housing Corporation undertook the construction of a number of major works including office buildings and residential quarters. The construction of the Administration Block at Gulshan Ground, Jammu, was completed in the record time of 14 months, whereas work on Administrative Block at Srinagar is nearing completion. The Corporation has now started work on Police Headquarters building at Gulshan Ground Jammu. Furhter, it is constructing 1253 Lower Subordinate quarters, majority of which are nearing completion.




J&K Police was given the honour of hosting 49th B.N. Mullik Memorial All India Police Football Championship 2000 at Srinagar (september 4-16).






