RACKET OF FAKE CURRENCY NOTES BUSTED


On June, 12, during a routine checking and frisking of vehicles, fake currency notes of Rs.39 thousands were recovered from a Maruti car in down town area of Sopore. Two persons, on board the Maruti car, were taken into custody for questioning. During the investigation, joint raids were conducted by police and BSF at several places in the valley and an amount of rupees 31.63 lacs, in fake currency, and also a computer were recovered.

D Jammu police busted a racket, involved in issuing the fake driving licence, Registeration certificates and motor vehicle documents etc., by arresting the kingpin of the racket, identified as Surjit Singh, a native of Beli Charana, Jammu. Fake documents including eleven registration certificates, blank permit documents and fake seals and stamps of RTOs, Board of Inspectors and Licencing Authorities etc were also recovered.

MAJOR SUCCESSES IN ANTI MILITANCY

② 21 militants, 16 belonging to HM,3 to Tehreek-Jehad Islami and 2 to JeM out fit, surrendered before the authorities in the border district of Kupwara on June, 01. The surrendered included launching chief, Mohd Yousuf Wani, Battalion Commander, Tanveer Ahmed, and District commander, Altaf Husssain Mir, all belonging to HM outfit. 12 more pak trained militants laid down their arms and surrendered before the civil administration at Drugmulla, Kupwara on June, 05.

Jammu police arrested a dreaded terrorist of LeT, identified as Mohd Arshad, code Abu Akasa, S/o Mohd Ishaq, a native of Gunda Singh Bala, Kasoor, Pakistan. During interrogation, he disclosed that he had been tasked to launch fidayeen (suicidial) attacks on vital installations in Jammu city.

Two of the 05 Fidayeen militants, who had escaped after a Fidayeen attack on district Police Line, Doda, on May 30, 2002, were gunned down by SOG Doda and 10 RR, in a joint operation in Gundna area of Doda district on June 06. The slain militants were identified as Abu Mohd Asif, a Pak national and Abu Talah, a native of Gundna village of Doda district.
