### WORKSHOP ON "POLICE INVESTIGATION - TECHNIQUES AND TRENDS"

A 10-day long workshop on "police investigation-Techniques and trends" held at Sheir-e-Kashmir Police Training Academy, Udhampur (May 25-June 03), concluded on June 03. Shri Gurbachan Jagat, Director General of Police, J&K, who was the Chief Guest, inaugurated the workshop on May, 25. The workshop was organised by the Police Academy as an awareness programme for the Police for meeting the future challenges. Holding of such programme is a continuing process. Similar workshops were held in the Academy on important themes including "Terrorism Counter Action", "Human Rights" and "Police Prosecution Planning and presentation," during the current year.

In his inaugural speech, Shri. Gurbachan Jagat, Director General of Police, J&K, emphasised that Police shall have to prepare itself for combating Cyber Crime, Cyber terrorism, Narco-terrorism and other High-tech crimes, which pose a threat to the security of the State. He cautioned the officers about the dangers which shall have to be faced due to the explosion in the information technology. He also explained the importance of proper investigation system.

The inaugural function was attended by senior Police Officers including Sh. Gopal Sharma, Addl. Director

General of Police and Shri. R.V. Raju, IGP. Shri Gopal Sharma, Addl. Director General of Police, made a graphic presentation on the Cyber crime while dwelling on the subject.

In his valedictory address, Justice O.P. Sharma laid emphasis on qualitative and scientific investigation. He underscored the need for specialisation in the field of investigation in view of the hightech crime and future challenges and lauded the efforts made by the Academy in this direction. The investigation is a controlled exercise limited by the code of criminal procedure, he added. He also referred to 10 commandments, as laid down in the Apex Court Judgement in D.K. Basu's case regarding arrest of suspects.

In his welcome address, Shri. Masud Chowdhary, Director, Sher-i-Kashmir Police Training Academy, Udhampur, outlined the objective of the workshop and recounted the future challenges and also identified the problem areas, constraints and limitations. He also enumerated the consensus points and solutions which emerged during the deliberations of the workshop. These included ways and means for skill enrichment, Stress management, Time



management, Use of latest scientific gadgets, Proper supervision and Follow-up of cases in the courts.

### **Orientation Course for the investigation of Economic Offences**

The Crime Branch of J&K Police, which investigates the bulk of cases of cheating, Criminal breach of trust, misappropriation and forgery, organised a week long (May 19-June 03) Orientation course for the investigating Officers of Crime Branch of J&K Police. "Financial investigation" was the theme of the programme.

A comprehensive course was devised and 30 investigating officers participated in the said programme, Shri R.V. Raju, IGP, Shri Rakesh Goel, Director Narcotics Control Bureau, Shri R.K. Jain, DD, IB, Regional Director, RBI, Senior prosecutors and Income Tax Officers delivered the lectures.

### **Major achievement of J&K Police Housing Corporation**

The J&K Police Housing Corporation, incorporated under the companies Act. 1956, on Dec. 26, 1997 with DGP as its chairman and a police officer of and above the rank of IGP as its Managing Director became functional towards the end of 1998. Shri Madan Lal, IPS was appointed as the Managing Director of this Corporation. The major achievements which the corporation has registered include:-

\* Completion of 5 storeyed administrative block at Gulshan Ground, Jammu in a record time of 16 months. For the construction of this block with a total carpet area of 47300 sqft., an amount of Rs. 3.43 crores was incurred. The cost included provision of 400 KVA electric sub station, passengers elevator, Diesel generator set, furniture and

furnishing items besides provisions for ACs, water coolers and approach road. The complex has been taken over to house the offices of ADGP/IGP Armed Police, Managing Director, J&K Police Housing Corporation, IGP, Home Guard/Civil Defence, DIG, Armed Police and Director Police Telecommunication.

- \* A four storeyed L-shaped building at batmalo, Srinagar, with a carpet area of 19894 Sft., costing Rs. 2.50 crores, to house the Offices of IGP Kashmir Zone, Srinagar, DIG Srinagar-Budgam range, IGP Traffic, IGP Security, SSP Sgr. and SSP Crime Branch Srinagar is nearing completion. The Corporation was entrusted with the construction of 1253 residential units for police personnel at various District Headquarters in the state. The Corporation has taken in hand the construction of 360 units at Bemina By-pass, Srinagar, 72 units each at Kupwara and baramulla, 368 units at Jammu, 120 units at Kathua, 72 units at Udhampur, 96 units at Doda and 48 units each at Rajouri and Poonch. The construction of these residential units is nearing completion.
- \* The construction work of Divisional Office of the corporation at Jammu was completed in Nov. 1999 and construction of Divisional Office at Srinagar is nearing completion.
- \* The Corporation constructed two Police Station buildings at Trikuta Nagar, Jammu and Maisuma, Srinagar.

The newly constructed administrative block was inaugurated by the Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, on May 24. He also laid the foundation stone of the Administrative Block of PHQ, on the same day at Gulshan Ground, Jammu.

### **ON-THE-SPOT POLICE RECRUITMENT**

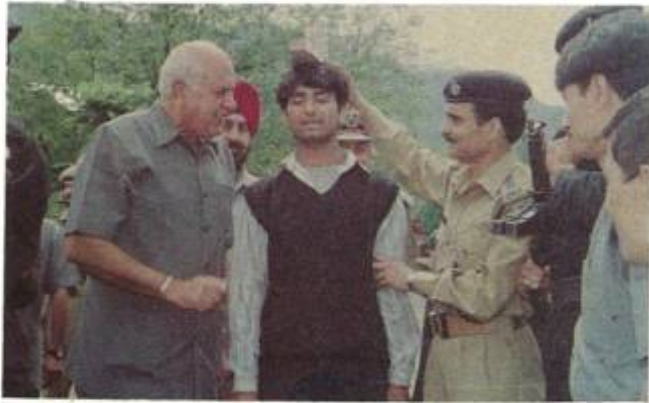
On-the-spot selection for the post of Police constables was made in the down-town area of Srinagar city on June 03. 206 youth were selected as constables.
