Newer challenges, confronting the police in the state, have necessitated imparting advance-training skills to the men of J&K Police. New subjects including 'policing the environment' and 'Techno Busting' have been added to the Syllabi of training at Sher-e-Kashmir Police Academy Udhampur.

A batch of 34 police officers were imparted training in identifying and tracking down the invisible enemy through a mobile phone call, during the month of May 2005.
