CTC Lethpora came into existence in the year 2009. It is situated near Village Barsoo of District Pulwama which is two and half kms away from Srinagar-Jammu National Highway. The construction work of building infrastructure including Barracks, Administrative Block, GOs' Mess, CO's/Principal's, GOs residence and NGOs' and others' residential blocks of this newly established training institute spread in 354 kanals of land is almost complete. Shri Suresh Kumar SSP Commandant IRP 18th Bn is having the distinction of being the first principal of CTC Lethpora under whose control and command the 1st batch of BRTC comprising 569 recruits of newly raised IRP BNs of J&K have commenced their basic recruit training course in January 2010 and passed out in June 2011 after completion of training successfully.

SERIES OF HIGH LEVEL MEETINGS HELD TO REVIEW SHRI AMARNATH JI YATRA SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS

Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS Director General of Police J&K chaired a series of high level meetings to review the security arrangements for smooth conduct of Shri Amarnath Ji Annual Yatra-2011 commencing from June 29 and culminating on August 13, 2011.

During the meeting on June 1st, 2011 at Jammu the DGP asked the officers to make sincere efforts for providing basic amenities to the pilgrims of Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra at various transit and lodging centers across Jammu city to ensure their comfortable stay before leaving for the destination. He emphasized for establishment of joint control rooms for better and close coordination with other sister agencies to ensure smooth conduct of pilgrimage.

The DGP advised the police officers to ensure humane approach while dealing with public and cautioned them to remain extra vigilant while dealing with criminal and anti social elements. The DGP also issued instructions to the officers for conducting frequent checking / search operations in the suspected areas to neutralize the dreaded terrorists operating inside the state.

Shri Dilbag Singh IPS IGP Jammu Zone made a detailed presentation on all the arrangements made for the pilgrimage. During the meeting police officers heading different jurisdictions apprised the DGP about the overall security scenario in their respective districts and steps being taken to further gear-up the security arrangements.

The meeting among others was attended by Shri K. Rajendra Kumar IPS ADGP Armed/Law & Order, J&K; Shri Pawan Kotwal Divisional Commissioner Jammu besides Range DIsG, District SSsP and senior officers of CID/ Traffic Wings and Jammu based DIsG CRPF and BSF.

Two Similar high level yatra security review meetings held at Pahalgam and PHQ Srinagar on June 6 and June 18, 2011 respectively were also chaired by DGP J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS.

While addressing the meeting at Pahalgam base camp, the DGP said that sufficient security arrangements have been put in place from Pathankote to holy cave and sufficient manpower equipped with requisite logistics has already been activated to conduct yatra in a befitting manner. He asked the officers to utilize their previous experiences to plug all loop holes.

Jammu and Kashmir Police will provide every possible help to all other agencies connected with the yatra to make necessary arrangements for pilgrims- the DGP added.

SCHOLARSHIPS WORTH RS. 9 LACS SANCTIONED IN FAVOUR OF CHILDREN OF POLICE PERSONNEL

A meeting of executive body of Police Pariwar Fund was held at Police Headquarters J&K Srinagar under the Chairmanship of Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K on June 22, 2011. During the meeting it was announced that scholarships worth Rs. 9 lacs have been sanctioned in favour of 230 school going children of J&K Police personnel. Among 230 children, scholarship worth Rs. 8 lacs were sanctioned in favour of 166 children of police martyrs and Rs. 1 lac was sanctioned in favour of 64 meritorious wards of serving police personnel who have secured 75% and above marks in class 8th and 9th during the academic session 2010-11.
