### J&K POLICE ASSERTING ITSELF-CHIEF MINISTER

Dr Farooq Abdullah, Chief Minister of J&K has praised police personnel for their active role in counter-insurgency operations and asserting themselves in facing challenges posed

by the militants. Dr Abdullah disclosed that the performance of the local police had come in for praise during a high level meeting convened by the Union Home Minister on May 20. The Chief Minister, who was speaking at a function organized to observe the Police Telecom week at Srinagar on May 21, cautioned the policemen against attacks on police posts and personnel and wanted them to give a befitting reply. The Chief Minister released the Police telephone directory and also presented awards to officers and jawans of Police Telecom wing for winning various competitions organised during the week. Dr Farooq Abdullah went round an exhibition of Telecom equipment and saw the Mobile communication van commissioned for the first time by the State Police.

Shri Gurbachan Jagat, Director General of Police, J&K, highlighted the need for further upgrading of Telecom network

for facing the proxy war. The DGP praised the courage being displayed by police officers and paid rich tributes to Shri Gulbadan Singh, DySP, who laid down his life while fighting militants.

Shri Navin Agarwal, DPT, gave a round-up of the activities and upgradation programmes undertaken by the Telecom wing. Shri I.S. Malhi, Financial Commissioner(Home), Shri S.S. Ali, ADGP Armed Police and Shri R. Tikoo, ADGP CID were present on the occasion besides other senior Police officers.

A cultural programme followed by *Bara Khana* was also organised in the PCR complex, Srinagar.

police offices more people friendly by providing a single window public utility service to redress their problems quickly and in a fixed time frame. The citizens can approach the **HELP SITES** personally or use Police Mail Boxes, which have been fixed at 6 different places in Srinagar town. SP Hqrs./DySP Hqrs. assisted by other staff will look after the cell.

including members of legislatures and retired Police Officers were present on the occasion. The DGP underlined the need for change in the attitude to make the police force service-oriented. He announced that the time had come to revive the traditional role of civil police in protecting the lives and property of common citizens. The DGP had no doubt that the J&K Police was prepared to give a final blow to the militancy in the State.

### **STRESS MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME CONCLUDES:**

A 2-day stress management workshop organized by Mumbai based expert Dr Deepak Rao, concluded at the Police Headquarters in Srinagar on May 08. Shri Gurbachan Jagat, DGP J&K, presided over the inaugural session on May 07. Over 70 Gazetted and Non-gazetted officers of various wings of J&K Police, including STF, participated in the workshop.

While some amount of stress is necessary for optimum output in an organization like Police, excessive levels of stress cause physiological and psychological disorders, said Dr Rao. The first session was devoted to identify stressors which

included performance, threat, frustration, boredom, and bereavement. The importance of diet particularly avoiding excessive use of salt, caffeine and sugar were illustrated with examples. Dr Rao enumerated delegation of work and time management as important tools for police officers to keep themselves cool to tackle with important areas without involving in trifles.

The second session entitled "Fountain of Youth" was devoted to the cause of premature aging and how to prevent its adverse effects. While aging is genetically controlled, obesity, stress, lack of exercise, addictions, faulty diets and blood pressure/blood sugar were cited as causes of heart ailment. A 7-minute exercise schedule for relaxing various parts of the body was demonstrated by Dr Rao. The workshop was sponsored by Shri Ajay Gupta of SR Telecom, Jammu.

Shri Gulbadan Singh, Deputy Superintendent of Police, SOG Kupwara, exhibiting highest sense of duty and conspicuous bravery, made supreme sacrifice of his life on May 12, while fighting militants at village Gulgam near Kupwara. The 35-year old officer and his party fought valiantly but met a tragic end by receiving bullet injuries in his head. The operation left

UMG, 2 AK Rifles, 2 Pistols, 10 Hand grenades and ammunition were recovered from the spot. A Sub Inspector of 1990 batch, Shri Gulbadan Singh earned out of turn promotions as Inspector and Deputy Superintendent of Police. He is survived by his wife and two sons. Gulbadan Singh was a recipient of President's Police Medal for gallantry for his role in numerous challenging assignments and anti-militancy operations.

Dr Farooq Abdullah, Chief Minister, J&K laid a wreath on the body of Shri Gulbadan Singh at Srinagar airport. The mortal remains of late Shri Gulbadan Singh were consigned to flames at village Kaleeth on May 13. Minister of State (Home) Shri Ali Mohmad Sagar, Tourism Minister Shri Ajat Shatru Singh and the DGP J&K, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, attended the funeral. Earlier, glowing tributes were paid to the departed hero at a function in PCR Complex at Srinagar in which hundreds of colleagues of Shri Gulbadan Singh paid their last respects.

### MURDER CASE SOLVED BY AWANTIPUR POLICE

A murder case of September 1996 was solved recently by Awantipur Police. The accused was arrested and one AK-56 Rifle, a magazine and rounds recovered. At the time of murder, the case had erroneously been labelled as one of militant violence but investigations showed that the killing was the result of a land dispute. The chief of Police, District Awantipur, led the investigating party.
