KASHMIR MILITANCY HAS DIED DOWN : AS DULAT

Shri A.S. Dulat, former RAW Chief and aide of the Prime Minister, delivered the key note address "Kashmir-the way ahead" at an impressive function held in the auditorium of Regional Research, Laboratory, Jammu, on Feb. 01, on the eve of the 3rd Amar Kapoor Memorial lecture. The function, organised by J&K Police in memory of late Shri Amar Kapoor, Addl. DGP, was attended by Cabinet Ministers, Legislators, academicians, media personalities, prominent citizens of the state and senior Civil, Police and Military officers, and was presided over by the Chief minister of J&K, Dr. Farooq Abdullah.

In his keynote address, Shri A.S. Dulat said that the Kashmir militancy has died down in the state and Pakistan is sustaining it through foreign mercenaries. He regretted that the response of Pakistan has not been matching to the peace initiative of Indian Prime Minister, Shri A.B. Vajpayee. The initiative on Kashmir by the Prime Minister has been welcomed by all and got overwhelming response

in J&K and has been described as courageous and imaginative by the international community including the friends of Pakistan and OIC. India has expressed readiness to talk to Pakistan Generals, who were behind the Kargil intrusion and now at the helm, provided Islamabad gives genuine and adequate response to the PM's Peace initiative, Sh. Dulat added.

Know Late Mr. Amar Kapoor
Mr. Amar Kapoor, an IPS officer of 1964 batch, has served the state and the country with courage, determination and valour. A tireless and methodical officer led the state intelligence agency in the most crucial phase of militancy. A recipient of Indian Police Medal for meritorious service and President's Police Medal for distinguished service, Mr. Kapoor, passed away in 1995 due to cardiac arrest. He has left his imprints on every sphere of police organisation. He was one of the most affectionate officers of the force.

Paying tributes to Mr. Amar Kapoor, he referred to his association in IB and then in J&K during his stint in the state. He was the most competent and eligible to dawn DGP's robes among the state cadre officers, Shri A.S. Dulat added.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, Chief Minister, J&K said that for buying peace with Islamabad, India can not part with even an inch of J&K. He would rather prefer death than to be parted to Paki-

stan, he added. Appreciating the Prime minister for initiating a meaningful process to bring peace and tranquillity in the state, he opined that conversion of LOC into International Border (IB) was the only solution to the problem. He lauded Indian democracy that gives people right to freedom of expression and referred to APHC leaders visiting Pak Embassy every now and then to seek instructions and said it was possible only in democratic India.

The Chief Minister paid rich tributes to Mr. Amar Kapoor and said that he was a highly professional officer who contributed a lot to the Police force.

Speaking on the occasion, the DGP, J&K, paid rich tributes to Shri Amar Kapoor. He said that J&K Police is fully geared up and prepared to face any challenge because the force has the bravest of the brave men who are trained and groomed to fight. He gave a detailed account of the ground situation and Pakistan's efforts to unleash an unending trial of bloody violence and expressed hope that proxy war in Kashmir will soon end and peace reestablished.

A lively question-answer session helped to bring out various facts about the "Kashmir-the way ahead."

In his welcome address, Shri P.S. Gill, IGP, Director, SKPTA, said that the need of the hour is to delve deep into new ways of thinking about training of Police personnel and devising methods. The areas which need to be concentrated include fiscal management, legal issues and trends in administration, human resources management and de-

velopment, strategic planning and policy development, he added. Stressing on the need to imparting professional training to policemen he said that successful officers are not born but developed over time through advanced education and professional training.

Addressing the meeting Shri A.K. Suri, Director General of Police, J&K, said that in a democratic set-up, the Police has to dedicate itself completely to the service of society. He exhorted the policemen to work in tandem with the urges and aspirations of the public and assume the same mantle as that of British Policemen who is approached as a friend and a guide by his people. As a role model, police should come forward to resolve the problems and alleviate the sufferings of people effectively and efficiently, the DGP added.

Responding to the issues raised at the meeting the DGP said that the project report prepared by the SKPTA shall be examined and sent to the government. Various decisions were taken on spot.

SPECIAL RECRUITMENT DRIVE OF J&K POLICE

In pursuance to the instructions of the Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, on-the-spot recruitments in J&K Police were held at Various places under the supervision of Shri A.K. Suri, DGP, J&K. As many as 258 physically robust youth were recruited during the Special Recruitment drives on the spot. The mechanism adopted for recruitment was to pick up the best among those who fulfilled the prescribed physical and educational standards, which made the recruitment process transparent.
