POP AT POLICE ACADEMY UDHAMPUR

**WE ARE LIVING IN A GREAT DEMOCRACY
AND DEMOCRACY IS NOT BATTLE OF GUNS,
BUT BATTLE OF IDEAS: CHIEF MINISTER, J&K.**

Underlining the vital role of J&K Police in restoring peace and normalcy in the state, the Chief Minister said that the local police is better placed than any other force to change the ground situation by their compassion for innocents and poor and firmness for law breakers. The task before the police is not easy one and to tackle the situation and meet the emerging challenges, police have to acquire requisite skills and professionalism for which the proper training should be a continuing process, he added. He exhorted the Police that while dealing with militancy related crime, they should not lose sight of tackling normal crime, which is an important part of policing

Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, C.M, J&K, was speaking at the attestation-cum-passing out parade (POP) ceremony of 314 passing out officers, including 51 Dy.SsP, 35 Prosecuting Officers, 221 Sub-Inspectors and 07 ASIs, at Sher-i-Kashmir Police Academy, Udhampur on Feb. 22.

Earlier, the Chief Minister inspected the parade and took salute at an impressive marchpast.

Speaking on the occasion, the Director General of Police, Shri A.K. Suri, spelled out the innovative measures taken to make police more responsive, accountable and humane in its functioning. He exhorted the passing out officers that the service of the people and redressal of their grievances should be their mission. He gave them a piece of advice: "Henceforth uniform should be your religion; uniform grants you an element of authority; never misuse your authority; never do any such thing which may tarnish the image of the Police force; and be polite but firm and impartial to the core and always uphold the rule of law."

Dr. Ashok Bhan, Director, SKPA, Udhampur, in his welcome address gave a resume of the functioning of the police Academy as also the modernisation of the training facilities and infrastructure upgrading. Every year 3000 officers and other ranks receive inservice and basic training in the Academy and the number is being increased to 5000 from this year, he added.

Shri Hemant Lohia, Assistant Director of the Academy, administered the oath of allegiance to the passing out officers.

H.E. THE GOVERNOR LAUDS J&K POLICE



In his address to the Joint Session of the State Legislative Assembly, H.E. the Governor, Shri Girish Chander Saxena, complimented the State Police for gaining professional competence to qualify it for performing internal security role without having to resort to any compartmentalized specialist arms. FAKE CURRENCY RACKET BUSTED BY SRINAGAR POLICE

Srinagar Police busted a racket, involved in the printing of fake currency and certificates, by arresting 04 persons, on Feb. 08. Fake currency notes, bundles of certificates of various professional educational Institutes, colleges and Universities, Computers, Scanners and Printers were seized from the arrested persons. The arrested persons were identified as Fayaz Ahmed Khawaja, Ishfaq Javed Masoodi, Nazir Ahmed and Manzoor Ahmed Bhat.

ISI's MODE OF TRANSPORTING CURRENCY NOTES UNEARTHED BY JAMMU POLICE

Jammu police arrested two terrorists, identified as Dillawar Ahmed Naik (code Zabiullah) and

Mudassar Ahmed Wani (code Saifullah) from village Pounichak in Damana area of Jammu district on Feb. 02. Indian currency worth Rs. 06 Lakhs and weapons and ammunition, including one AK 56 rifle and a wireless set were recovered from the arrested terrorists.

The currency notes in the denomination of Rs.1,000, and the wireless set was concealed inside the cavity of two cricket bats. The money was meant for top militant leaders of Lashkar-e-Tobia outfit and the arrested terrorists had infiltrated to this side of the border during the night intervening Feb. 01/02.

NEWS IN BRIEF

- ◆ Pandit Mangat Ram Sharma, Deputy Chief Minister, J&K laid the foundation stone of Administrative/Residential block of General Railway Police (GRP), Jammu, on Feb. 14. The construction work of the Administrative/Residential block has been taken up by the J&K Police Housing Corporation.

- ◆ DGP addressed a Darbar at DPL, Jammu on Feb. 03. The DGP stressed on discipline and dedication to work. He said that since a Police man happens to be the most visible face of the Government, he should not indulge in any such thing as may spoil the image of the Police force. He called upon the cops to always uphold the rule of law and never succumb to any pressure or temptation. Be firm but polite and impartial; set an example for others to

emulate by your conduct, DGP told Jawans and officers. He gave a patient hearing to the Police personnel. Various demands, which varied from personal to departmental and individual to collective group, were considered and orders issued on the spot.

- ◆ DGP visited Gool area and interacted with the jawans and officers of J&K Police who had carried out a successful operation against the terrorists; killed 04 and recovered a cache of weapons and ammunition. A Darbar of jawans was also held. The DGP issued on the spot instructions to the ADGP Armed and IGP Jammu Zone, who accompanied him, to ameliorate the living conditions of the jawans. He announced a package of incentives including special cash rewards, in recognition of the commendable anti-militancy operations, in favour of the police personnel, on the spot.
- ◆ J&K Police scored the highest number of goals (24), in the 51st All India Police Hockey Championship at Mumbai (Feb. 01-10), in the preliminary matches. It lost to Punjab Police in quarter finals by two goals to one.

- ◆ Microsurgery has been introduced in Police Hospital Srinagar. Microsurgery technique is a recent addition to the everexpanding field of Medicine. Microsurgery basically involves operating on structures, which are not usually visible by naked eye with the aid of an operating microscope. In ENT, the technique is mostly employed for operation on the ear. Till recently Microsurgery facility was available only at few Hospitals and the facility has been successfully started in Police Hospital, Srinagar. The facility started in January and six patients have been benefitted so far. Dr. Bilal Ahmad Raja of Police Hospital Srinagar is performing the surgeries under Microscope.
