MARTYRS SYMBOLISE NATION'S STRENGTH AND VALOUR: C.M. J&K.

In memory of the martyrs, who, while discharging their duty, made supreme sacrifice of their lives for maintaining security and territorial integrity of the country and brought glory to Police force, J&K Police has embarked on a major effort to set-up Martyrs Memorials in Jammu and Srinagar. 10 architectural designs have been received from ace architects of the country for the proposed memorials.

On February 25, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, C.M. J&K, witnessed the architectural designs of the proposed memorials at Gulshan Ground, Jammu. He evinced keen interest in the designs and discussed their features and gave suggestions for making the memorial a real piece of art.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister said that the grateful nation will always be indebted to its martyrs, who symbolise nation's strength and valour. He further observed that the plaque of the memorial should carry the names of all the ranks of the Police force who attained martyrdom in fighting militancy and protecting the lives of civilians. The posterity should know about the warriors who gave their today for our tomorrow, the C.M. added.

Shri A.K. Suri, DGP, J&K, explained to the Chief Minister the architectural plans as also the modalities and the choice etc. of the Memorials. He disclosed that the memorial at Jammu is likely to cost Rs. One crore and would be completed within six months after taking up the construction at the proposed site.

Shri Gopal Sharma, ADGP, Armed, Shri Kuldeep Khoda, ADGP, CID, Shri M.Y. Khan, Chairman, J&K Bank Ltd., Senior Police officers, a host of Engineers and architects were present on the occasion.

J&K POLICE SPONSORS LECTURE ON "INDIA'S SECURITY CONCERNS."

A lecture on "India's Security Concerns", organized by the State unit of the Indian Institute of the Public Administration (IIPA) and sponsored by Jammu and Kashmir Police was delivered by Shri G. Parthasarathi, an eminent former diplomat, at Jammu Club, Jammu, on February, 15. The lecture was attended by the Chief Minister, who also presided over the function, his cabinet colleagues, Senior civil, Police, military and intelligence officers, a galaxy of academicians, journalists and prominent citizens.

In his keynote address, Shri G. Parthasarathi emphasized the need for viable economic linkage between the nations in the Indian subcontinent. Although Pakistan will avoid joining

such a union yet India must assume the role of big brother by building nexus of economic prosperity with the help of neighbouring countries, he added. On Pakistan, he said that it has neither forgotten nor forgiven India for its 1971 debacle and the Pak Army shall always thrive on India bashing. He held the stand taken by India after September 11, as quite positive. General Musharraf has been forced to take some steps, though under compulsion and not by conviction, Shri Parthasarathi added. About China he said that it was always trying to contain India for his Political and diplomatic compulsions which is why Pakistan has been provided military aid including M-9 and M-18 missiles.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah called for a well evolved strategy to deal with Pakistan, who is adding & abetting terrorism on Indian soil and has struck hell on the people of Jammu & Kashmir.

The function concluded with a lively question-answer session which brought out various facets of India's security concerns.
