RECOGNISE SACRIFICES OF MARTYRS - DGP

Shri Gurbachan Jagat, DGP J&K, has emphasized the need for due recognition to the sacrifices made by police personnel while defending the security and integrity of the Country. He was speaking

at a function held in DPL Jammu on April 18 in memory of police personnel who made the supreme sacrifice of their lives. The DGP and other senior officers distributed sewing machines, blankets and cash assistance of Rs.5,000/- to next of kin of each martyr. While the J&K Police spent Rs.3.95 Lakhs for the presentations, some individuals and voluntary organisations also contributed to the cause. Shri Jagat exhorted officers to maintain a close liaison with the families of the deceased police personnel and give them a feeling of being members of the large police family. He also appealed the media to objectively evaluate the difficult circumstances in which police personnel work and highlight the sacrifices made, which often go unnoticed.

IGP Jammu Shri Kuldeep Khoda welcomed the DGP and gave details of welfare activities undertaken for the families of deceased police personnel. The function was attended by Shri M.M. Khajooria, former DGP; Shri T.R. Kalra, former Addl.DGP; Shri S.S. Wazir, Member, State Human Rights Commission and a former Addl.DGP and a large number of Police Officers.

CHIEF SECRETARY INAUGURATES OPD BLOCK

Shri Ashok Jaitly, Chief Secretary, J&K, inaugurated the OPD block of Police Hospital Jammu on April 02. The OPD block has been constructed at a cost of Rs.7.62 Lakhs by the Police Construction Division. Shri Jaitly also was shown around newly constructed barracks for *jawans* of JKAP and a model kitchen cum

dinning hall complex. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Ashok Jaitly praised the performance of J&K Police particularly in anti-militancy operations and called upon officers and men to work towards restoring confidence of the people and help in bringing complete peace to the State. He also wanted Police Hospitals to serve as models for other hospitals run by the Government.

The DGP Shri Gurbachan Jagat, while welcoming the Chief Secretary, highlighted the measures taken to strengthen and modernise the police force during the last one year. Shri H.H. Tayabji, Financial Commissioner (Agriculture); Shri S.S. Ali, Addl. DGP; Shri B.S. Jaswal, Divisional Commissioner, Jammu and senior Police Officers attended the function. Shri Gopal Sharma, IGP (Hqrs.), presented a report about status of housing facilities for J&K police personnel and highlighted the need for increasing the satisfaction level. Shri Madan Lal, MD J&K Police Housing Corporation, presented a vote of thanks.

ANOTHER SUCCESS FOR SOG SRINAGAR

Abdul Hamid, the founder Chairman of Shoora-e-Jehad, an alliance of six pro-Pak militant organisations, was killed in an encounter with Special Operations group in the outskirts of Srinagar.

One Pistol was recovered from the possession of the slain militant. SOG has now launched a multi-pronged strategy to wipe out militancy by identifying and destroying hideouts, cutting the supply lines of food etc., identifying and arresting their guides and stopping the flow of funds.

Srinagar district police continued its crackdown on militants by apprehending a group of 5 commanders and seizing a large quantity of arms and ammunition from their hideouts. With this the police

has solved two cases of murder, one incident of attempt to murder and seven grenade throwing incidents. 16 criminals/militants were apprehended by Srinagar police solving several cases of murders, extortions and dacoities. Four of the arrested belonged to HM while others were criminals who were threatening people and extorting money.

SOG Kupwara recovered a rich haul of weapons and ammunition which was displayed in a press conference held in PCR Srinagar.

PROMOTIONS AND GALLANTRY AWARDS

Shri Rajinder Tikoo, an IPS officer of 1970 batch, has been promoted as Addl. Director General of Police and Shri Masud Choudhary as an Inspector General of Police. While Shri Tikoo will head the State CID, Shri Choudhary will be the Director of recently upgraded Police Academy at Udhampur.

49 Inspectors of Police were promoted as DySsP by the State Government whereas placement of 60 Inspectors as DySsP was also ordered. 50 SIs, 142 ASIs, 46 HCs and 300 SG Constables were also promoted to next rank during the month.

The President of India has been pleased to award Police Medals for gallantry to S/Shri Farooq Khan, SP Doda; R.K. Jalla, I/c SP (Ops.) Anantnag; G.S. Bhau, I/c DySP(Ops.) Kupwara; SI Aman-Ullah Khan, Balwinder Singh and Mohd. Yaqoob.

POLICE ACADEMY TO MEET CHALLENGES OF 21ST CENTURY

The State Government has upgraded the Police Training College at Udhampur to the level of an Academy to give impetus to police training and meet future challenges before the force. Imparting training on behaviour, human rights, scientific aids and anti-insurgency operations will be amongst the priorities and research in police sciences will be encouraged so that the training curriculum caters to the ground requirements and expectations of the people.

The Academy is proposed to be affiliated to a University for better academic interaction and quality research which will eventually pave way for award of degrees in police administration. Faculties of behavioural sciences and management are proposed to be added and services of judicial officers will be sought on deputation for imparting better training. Shri Masud Choudhary has been posted as the first Director of the Academy.
