POLICE OFFICES RE-OPEN IN SUMMER CAPITAL

MARTYR SHALLEY SINGH

Shri Shalley Singh, Dy.SP, attained martyrdom in an encounter with terrorists at village Udrana, Baderwah (Doda) on May 30. Amidst scenes of sighing, wailing and recitation of *Guru-bani* by the thousands of friends, relatives and colleagues, the funeral gathering, his Mortal Remains were consigned to flames at Shastri Nagar (Jammu) Cremation Ground on May 31, with full Police Honours. Earlier, people in thousands thronged the District Police Lines Jammu, where the mortal remains of the martyred Dy.S.P was kept, and prominent among those who paid tributes to the departed soul by laying floral wreath were Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Shri Rigzin Jora, Hon'ble Minister for Power, Haji Nisar Ali, Hon'ble Minister for Social Welfare, Shri C. Phunsog, Chief Secretary J&K, Shri Gopal Sharma, Director General of Police, J&K and Dr.S.P.Vaid, IGP Jammu.

Born on April 12, 1978, Shri Shalley Singh joined J&K Police on October 10, 1996, as Inspector, after he lost his father, late Inspector Udhey Vir Singh, in a terrorist attack at Jammu.

Shri Shalley Singh was promoted to the rank of Dy.SP on June 10, 2002 and remained posted as SDPO, Shopian, Kashmir (July 04, 2002 to May 21, 2003), J&K Armed Police (August 08, 2003 to November 11, 2004) and Dy.S.P (Operations) Jammu since November 11, 2004 till the time he attained martyrdom. He was actively associated in anti-militancy operations in the state, with numerous notable achievements to his credit, which include the planning and execution of a search operation in the forests of Jhangera (Billawar) on February 27, 2007, in which a most dreaded terrorist of Lashkar-e-Toiba, identified as Abu Tallah, was eliminated. He was recommended for the most coveted award of Presidents Police Medal for Gallantry Services.

FORMER IGP PASSES AWAY

Former IGP of Jammu and Kashmir, Shri Satnam Singh Oberoi, passed away on May 27 after a brief illness. He had retired from service in May 2003 after serving in J&K Police for 36 years. Born on May 16, 1943, after his post graduation from J&K University, He started his career as a Dy.S.P and rose to the post of Inspector General Police, by dint of his dedication and honesty. He was inducted into IPS on April 10, 1987. He held important assignments including SSP Crime, SSP Vigilance, DIG Security, DIG Armed Police, IG Law and Order, IG Human Rights and IG Traffic.
