### WE ARE COMMITTED TO FIGHT TERRORISM TO THE FINISH: DGP

On Oct. 21, 43rd Annual Police Commemoration Day was observed throughout the state with the renewed commitment to wipe-out militancy and bring back peace and tranquility. The state level function was held in the J&K Armed Police complex at Zewan, Srinagar. Shri G.C. Saxena, H.E. the Governor, J&K, was the Chief Guest at the function. Former Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, Union Minister for State for External Affairs, Shri Umar Abdullah, Chief Secretary, Shri I.S. Malhi, Addl. Chief Secretary (Home), Shri C. Phunsog, Director General of Police, Shri A.K. Suri, and senior civil and Police officers were present.

H.E. the Governor lauded the valour of Police, Army and Para-military forces for meeting the challenges of militancy in Jammu and Kashmir. "We are not through the time of test yet but surely the blood of martyrs will bear the fruit", H.E. the Governor said. The compatriots will always remain indebted to the martyrs of J&K Police that has emerged as force to reckon with, the H.E. the Governor added.

On this Occasion, families of the 34 martyrs were

presented "Tagma-e-Shahada" by H.E. the Governor.

Paying tributes to the martyrs on the occasion of Police Commemoration Day, the DGP said that the sacrifices of the martyrs have enthused a renewed commitment in police force to fight and eliminate the menace of Pak sponsored terrorism and restore complete normalcy in the state. We are committed to fight terrorism to finish, the DGP added.

Expressing concern about the welfare of families of the martyrs, the DGP said that they are inseparable part of the vast family of Police force. He spelled out various welfare measures taken for the families of the martyrs which included ex-gratia relief, scholarship to the children of martyrs, monetary assistance, adoption of the wards of martyrs by different schools and provision of jobs etc.

The DGP read out the names of Police martyrs, who sacrificed their lives with effect from Sept. 01, 2001 to August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2002 for the unity and integrity of the country.

Dr. Farooq Abdullah inaugurated the blood donation camp, held on the occasion.

Functions, to observe Police commemoration day, were held at Jammu and SKPTA Udhampur also.

### A BRAVE AND TRUE SOLDIER OF MOTHERLAND ATTAINS MARTYRDOM.

Shri Jagtar Singh, Dy.S.P DAR Kathua sacrificed his life while fighting terrorists at Hiranagar (Kathua) on Oct. 03.

Shri Jagtar Singh's service career, who joined the Police department in the year 1982 as Sub Inspector, is a story of brilliance. He is the recipient of President's Police Medal for Meritorious Service, President's Police Medal for Gallantry, President's bar to Police Medal for Gallantry, Chief of the Army Commendation Card and DGP's Medal. His contribution in anti-militancy operations are enviable.

The body of Dy.S.P. Jagtar Singh was cremated with full state honour on Oct. 04. Dignitaries, prominent Civil

and Police officers and citizens including Prof. Chaman Lal Gupta, Union Minister for State for Defence, S. Harbans Singh, Minister for Sports and Employment, Shri A.K.
