This bold initiative- a step in the direction of addressing the sensitive and emotional issue of migrants, yearning to return to their roots, was taken at the behest of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, J&K, Jenab Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, with the following objectives in mind:-

- To give first hand feel of their roots in valley for a new vision to such children who were born after the eruption of militancy or had migrated at an unimpressionable age;
- To show the young blooms the beauty of their roots;

- To make them interact with the children in Kashmir for appreciate by the situation on ground and to clear the misconceptions, if any; and
- To promote fraternal relation and brotherhood.

During their 4-days stay in Kashmir Valley, the migrant students visited various scenic places including Phalgam, Gulmarg, Dal Lake, Mughal Gardens and also the holy pilgrimage places of Kheer Bhawani, Shankaracharya, Mattan and Hazratbal.

On October 16, the Hon'ble Chief Minister played host to the touring children at his official residence in Srinagar and served them Kashmiri delicacies. In the course of interaction, the Children formed a bee line for autographs and the Hon'ble Chief Minister responded to their desire and obliged them all. They also had group photographs with the Hon'ble C.M.

#### POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY

#### Ceremonial honour to martyrs by J&K police

The Police Commemoration Day function in Srinagar was held at J&K Armed Police Complex, Zewan. Jenab Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, Hon'ble Chief Minister, J&K, who was the Chief Guest, inspected the parade and took salute. The function was attended by legislators, Chief Secretary, Shri S. S. Bloeria, senior Civil, police and Para-military officers. Contingents of J&K police and Para military Forces including BSF & CRPF participated in the ceremonial parade.

A 2- minute silence was observed while the participating contingents reversed their Arms to pay homage to the martyrs. Hon'ble Chief Minister and other dignitaries including senior police officers laid floral wreaths on the Police Martyr's Memorial.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister paid rich tributes to the martyrs and said that the occasion provided an opportunity for paying homage to the police martyrs, who laid down their lives for defending the territorial integrity and lives of the people of the country, and emulating their sense of supreme sacrifice. Lauding the role of the state police, the Chief Minister said "the state police was playing a pioneering role along with the other security forces to give the situation a turn around

for the restoration of normalcy in J&K." The Security forces and the police have been able to maintain a human face by taking every possible precaution to protect civilians while dealing the militants, he added.

Shri Gopal Sharma, DGP, J&K read out the names of the 956 officers and men of Police and Para Military Forces of the country, who laid down their lives, during the past one year, which included 181 from J&K. Of the 181 martyrs from J&K, 110 are from J&K Police, 34 from CRPF, 31 from BSF, 5 from ITBP and one from SSB.

Paying rich tributes to martyrs, the DGP said that attaining martyrdom, while defending the motherland, is one of the noblest acts. The police will fight to the very last drop of blood for the integrity and security of the country, he added.

At Jammu, the Police Commemoration Day was held at district Police lines, Jammu, where IGP, Jammu, Shri P.L.Gupta was the chief guest.

Speaking on the occasion he paid tributes to the police martyrs and said that the sacrifices made by the police men shall act as driving force for serving officers and men to discharge their obligation with merit.

#### J&K POLICE ORGANISES NORTH KASHMIR SPORTS FESTIVAL


