PHQ REOPENES AT JAMMU FOR WINTER SESSION 2010-11

Police Headquarters J&K and other police move offices were closed at Srinagar on October 30, 2010 in connection with Bi-annual durbar move and reopened at Jammu on November 08, 2010.

On his arrival at PHQ Jammu Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K was accorded a warm welcome by heads of all wings of Police establishment and a large number of senior police officers at the lawns of PHQ. A smartly attired contingent of J&K Armed Police presented guard of honour to the DGP on the occasion.

The DGP accompanied by senior police officers visited various sections of PHQ, APHQ, PHC, Home guards/Aux. Police Hqrs., CID Hqrs., Crime Hqrs, Security Hqrs. and Railway Hqrs. During the visit DGP enquired about the welfare of police personnel especially accommodation facilities at Jammu and issued on spot instructions to the concerned heads for redressal of the problems of staff. The DGP also convened a meeting of senior police officers at his office chamber in PHQ and discussed various issues related to security scenario and law and order in the state.

HON'BLE CHIEF MINISTER J&K HELD VIDEO CONFERENCING WITH DISTRICT SSsP.

Shri Omar Abdullah Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K visited Police Headquarters J&K Jammu on Nov. 9 2010 and interacted with Shri K.Rajendra Kumar ADGP Armed/Law & Order J&K, Shri SM Sahai IPS IGP Kashmir, SPs of Districts of Kupwara, Baramulla, Pulwama and Districts of Shopian, Budgam, Anantnag turn by turn through video conferencing and reviewed the general law and order situation in these districts. In the three hour long video conferencing with the district Superintendents of Police of Kashmir division, the Hon'ble Chief Minister directed the SSsP to render their services to the society in the best professional manner. The Hon'ble Chief Minister highlighted the importance of cordial police-public relations to create conducive and peaceful environment for overall development and welfare of the state. He further said that professionalism in policing is imperative to maintain law and order in the State. "You are rendering multifaceted duties on various fronts

including maintenance of law and order, protection of life and property, combating militancy, dealing with untoward situation and booking culprits responsible for different crimes. This has increased pressure on you" the Chief Minister said. The Hon'ble Chief Minister assured every help and support from the government for modernizing and strengthening of J&K Police force to develop it as one of the most advanced & competent police forces in the country. He said the issues of filling up of vacant posts & rationalizing the duties of the police personnel were under active consideration of the government.

The Chief Minister made queries regarding various issues pertaining to the general policing, maintenance of law and order, combating militancy, holding of police-public interactions, training of the police personnel in mob control, measures in place for the security and protection of political leaders, civic action programmes and crime control.

Taking review of the preparedness of police for conducting

peaceful and smooth Panchayat elections in the State, the Chief Minister directed J&K Police force to be ready in all respects for successfully holding the Panchayat elections. The District SsP gave detailed account of the prevailing situation and measures in place to prevent untoward incidents and maintenance of law and order in their respective jurisdictions.

They also apprised the Chief Minister of their actions regarding bringing crime under control, maintaining rapport with general public by holding police public meetings and initiating welfare programmes for youth.

The ADGP Armed/Law & Order J&K Shri K Rajendra Kumar IPS and IG Kashmir Shri S.M.Sahai IPS gave overview of the general situation prevailing in the division. They also highlighted the issues relating to the modernization of J&K Police Force and strengthening its rank and files.

Among others the meeting was attended by Advisors to the Chief Minister, Shri Mubarak Gul and Shri Devender Singh Rana, Director General of Police J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda, IPS, Commissioner/Secretary Home, J&K Shri B.R. Shama IAS and senior police officers.
