J&K POLICE: CONQUERING THE HEARTS OF THE PEOPLE

On the morning of October-08, 2005, a devastating earthquake, measuring 7.4 on the Richter scale, ripped through the state of J&K. The nature's theatre of death and destruction began to unfold at 9:20 A.M and within minutes, the tragedy left about one thousand human beings dead, about 5,000 people injured and thousands of people homeless in hundreds of villages and far-flung hamlets in the areas of Uri, Tangdar, Teetwal, Baramulla and Poonch.

Keeping its high traditions of public service, *Jawans* and officers of J&K Police responded to the urgent call, committed themselves to rescue precious lives, buried in the debris, and to provide relief to the survivors in the form of medical help, shelter and food. Within an hour of the tragedy, about 300 police personnel were mobilized, who were amongst the first to reach the inaccessible and most effected areas in Uri. Uncaring of their personal comfort and rest, more than 1,000 Police personnel relentlessly put in heroic efforts in rendering selfless

and dedicated service to the people at a time they needed it the most. Shri Gopal Sharma, DGP, J&K paid frequent visits to the earthquake-affected areas for taking stock of the relief operations launched by the Jammu and Kashmir Police.


J&K Police remained in the forefront of the daunting tasks of providing succor to the hapless victims in the far-flung disheveled hamlets to heal the irreparable wounds of personnel lost and

grief. The tasks included:

- ✳ Rescuing the precious lives from the debris and ferrying the injured to various hospitals for medical aid;
- ✳ Extricating dead bodies from the debris and arranging their burial;
- ✳ Establishing free community kitchens (*langars*) from their own resources ;
- ✳ Ferrying and distributing ration and relief items;
- ✳ Setting up Medical Camps by

pressing into service their own medical and paramedical staff;

- Carrying out the disposal of carcasses;
- Coordinating the relief operations and assisting the civil administration in distributing food, clothes, blankets, utensils, tents and essential items supplied by the NGOs and other civil organizations;
- Constructing temporary sheds on war footing for resumption of the academics of the students of the quake-hit areas;
- Helping the people in salvaging their precious household items from the debris; and

- Constructing temporary sheds for the homeless.

J&K Police voluntarily contributed Rs. 1. 25 crore to the Chief Ministers Relief Fund for the rehabilitation of the people affected by earthquake.

The role of J&K Police in the rescue and relief operations to the victims of the natural calamity was highly appreciated by the people and lauded by both the print and electronic media. It also earned acclaimed admiration and appreciation by the Government.

☛ "Jammu and Kashmir Police has associated itself in a big way in organising relief and rescue operations for the earthquake hit people of twin districts of Baramulla and Kupwara..." — **Daily Excelsior**, dated October 11.

☛ "A well coordinated relief camp has been set up by the Jammu and Kashmir Police at Boniyar near Uri to dispatch relief material to the earthquake hit people of the area. A number of Police personnel today reached in the inaccessible and far-flung areas like Isham, Dardkot, Nawrunda, Chakra, Uroosa, Gowatta, and Chalan by trekking 14-Kilometer hilly distance on foot and carrying ration, medicines and other essentials on their back for the affected people. The Police have also restored wireless communication in the far-flung areas hit by earthquake facilitating the relief efforts in a big way... As many as 20 teams of masons and carpenters of Jammu & Kashmir Police too have been constituted and deputed to the tremor-affected areas to help in restoration of damaged shelters. The medical teams have also been rushed with adequate medicines to provide medicare to the needy..." — **Daily Excelsior**, dated October 14.

☛ "In its continuing efforts, the Jammu and Kashmir Police dispatched another batch of 12 trucks carrying relief items for earthquake victims. These trucks carried 200 tents, 500 sleeping bags and eatable items, were dispatched from Police Control Room here today for the victims of Karnah-Tangdar areas" — **Daily State Times**, dated October 11.

☛ "... The Police has set up *lungers*, arranged tentage, medicines, clothes and blankets for the tremor victims at various places at Uri and Tangdhar areas... On the instructions of Director General Police Gopal Sharma, the jawans of Police Training Centre, Sheri and District Police Lines of Baramulla and Kupwara, trekked long distances and were first to reach out to the earthquake victims in the inaccessible areas of Uri and Tangdar which have been badly affected — **Daily State Times**, dated October 11.

☛ "Chief Minister Mufti Mohammad Sayeed today visited the temporary sheds being constructed by J&K Police at Uri for the victims of the recent earthquake. Director General of Police, Gopal Sharma accompanied him. On this occasion, the Chief Minister was told that the Police have so far constructed 103 such temporary sheds in 31 villages of the area.... The Chief Minister also went to Salamabad where also he visited the temporary sheds constructed by the state Police". — **Daily Excelsior**, dated October 27.

Police Headquarters, J&K reopened in the winter capital on September 07 after the *Darbar Move* from Srinagar. The Civil Secretariat and other move offices also reopened in the winter capital, Jammu the same day. The move offices were closed at Srinagar on October 27.

Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister was presented the Guard of Honour by a contingent of J&K Police in the lawns of the secretariat. Hon'ble Chief Minister had a round of different offices of the Secretariat and interacted with the secretariat employees.






POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY

Ten valiant cops of CRPF sacrificed their precious lives, while fighting with the Chinese soldiers at Hot Springs in Ladhak, on Indo-China border, to save their motherland on October 21, 1959. Later, October 21 was declared as national day to pay homage to police martyrs. A Martyrs Memorial was constructed at Hot Springs and the mortal remains of the martyrs were placed in the central pillar on which the words "WHEN YOU GO HOME TELL THEM OF US, FOR THEIR TOMORROW WE GAVE UP OUR TODAY" were etched in cement. Also inscribed at the entrance was the English version of a verse from Bhagwat Gita: "ACTION IS THY DUTY REWARD IS NOT THY CONCERN" The first wreath was placed on the Memorial on August 15, 1962.

The Police and paramilitary Forces celebrate police Commemoration Day throughout the country as a national day for Police Martyrs in memory of all those Police personnel who have made supreme sacrifices for maintaining law and order and preserving the territorial integrity of the country.
