NEWLY CONSTRUCTED PHQ BUILDING INAUGURATED AT SRINAGAR

His Excellency the Governor of Jammu and Kashmir inaugurated the newly constructed PHQ building at Peerbagh Srinagar on October 09, 2008. Accompanied by his advisors, Dr S.S Bloeria and Shri H.H. Tyabji, the Governor inspected the six storied building. In his inaugural address, the Governor congratulated J&K Police for the new Headquarter and commended the courage and bravery it has been showing to combat terrorism and protecting the lives and property of the people besides maintaining law and order situation for the past two decades.

Dr S.S. Bloeria also spoke on the occasion and was all praise for the state police in its fight against militancy in addition to maintaining law and order in the state.

Earlier in his welcome address, Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K while highlighting the details of the constructional activities undertaken by the Police Housing Corporation, J&K across the state said that the construction for the PHQ building had started in August 2005 and completed in 2008. Stretched on 17 kanals, the building costs around rupees 17 crores. The DGP expressed his gratitude to His Excellency the Governor for expansion of Railway and traffic Police.

The DGP also added that an additional five Indian Reserve Police Battalions were in the process.

POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY OBSERVED ON OCTOBER 21

The J&K Police observed the Police Commemoration Day at Srinagar, Jammu and all other district Police headquarters on 21st October in the memory of police personnel who laid down their lives for the nation. The MHA has declared this day as National Police Day.

The state level function to honour the martyrs was observed at APC Zewan. His Excellency the Governor of J&K Shri N.N.Vohra who was the chief guest, took the salute. While addressing on the occasion, the Governor commended the J&K Police not only for its enhanced strength and transformation to an effective and disciplined force but also for the sacrifices its officers and jawans had made for

defending the integrity and honour of the nation while combating insurgency and maintaining law and order in the state.

Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K read out the names of 683 police and paramilitary personnel including 48 from J&K who had laid down their lives in the service of the nation between September 1st, 2007 and October 21st, 2008.

The DGP issued on spot directions to the concerned officers to redress the difficulties, if any faced by the officials.

Thereafter, the DGP chaired a meeting of senior police officers at PHQ and reviewed the over all security situation, law and order, traffic, security arrangements around the polling stations, places of public meetings, contesting candidates and other administrative matters across the state.

WELFARE CONCERN OF POLICE PERSONNEL

During the months of October/November 2008, PHQ J&K sanctioned Rs.1,84,40,640/- in favour of a number of serving & retired police personnel, wards & NOK's of serving, deceased/Martyred police personnel under various welfare schemes which include Rs.2.00 lacs as welfare loan to 19 serving police personnel, Rs. 0.91 lacs as welfare relief in favour of 61 serving police personnel, Rs. 20,000/- as relief to 03 retired police personnel, Rs.42,840/- as Meritorious scholarship to 51 wards of serving police personnel studying in 8th and 9th standards, Rs.91,800/- as scholarship to 33 wards of 14 police martyrs, Rs.1.26 Crores as Special Welfare relief in favour of NoK's of 21 deceased police personnel, Rs.8.00 Lakhs as Ex-gratia relief in favour of NoK's of 04 police martyrs, Rs.45.00 Lakhs sanctioned by MHA, GOI, New Delhi as additional amount of ex-gratia relief in favour of NoK's of 15 police martyrs and Rs.0.95 lacs as ex-gratia relief to 03 injured police personnel.
