POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY ORGANIZED

State level Police Commemoration Day function was organized by J&K Police at Zewan Srinagar on October 21, 2010. Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K Shri Omar Abdullah and Several dignitaries including Hon'ble Ministers, senior police Officers and family members of the Police martyrs who attended the function laid floral wreaths on the martyrs memorial and paid rich tributes to the Police martyrs.

Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K, Shri Omar Abdullah during the address lauded the role of J&K Police in combating militancy and maintaining law and order in the state. The Hon'ble Chief Minister said that the past 20 years have been the years of challenge for JKP personnel. "Concentrations on curbing militancy during these years has put normal policing at back burner" the Hon'ble CM said. He emphasized the need for rejuvenating the basic unit of Station House Officer to its prime importance.

Hon'ble Chief Minister further said that the rapport SHOs used to have with general public, respected citizens and elders in the area under their jurisdiction acted as important catalyst in maintaining law and order and restricting activities of unscrupulous elements and mischief mongers. He said that Government is working on a plan to make SHOs key functioning once again in the maintenance of peace.

Referring to the difficult times faced by the Jammu & Kashmir Police and other para-military forces engaged in maintenance of law and order situation in the state during recent times, Hon'ble Chief Minister said, "the patience you have exhibited during recent unrest is praise worthy and I would like to render the duty in this spirit and exhibit yourself as people's friends. You are for the society and society is for you—your basic duty is to safeguard your brethren and face the challenges with courage and patience".

The Chief Minister said that his government would render every support to the police department in building well trained and well equipped police force capable of dealing effectively with militancy as also law and order situations.

Highlighting the sacrifices made by the police force in the State and elsewhere during the times of law and order situation and militancy, the Chief Minister urged them to

uphold the oath they have taken while entering into the police force and render your service with honesty and dedication exhibiting high qualities of professionalism.

Paying rich tributes to police martyrs who lost their lives in militancy related incidents while maintaining law and order in the state, Hon'ble C.M lauded the families who have sacrificed their loved ones for the cause of the people and the State. He said that the welfare of these families was on top of the agenda of the government.

Expressing the hope that permanent peace will be restored in the State, the Hon'ble Chief Minister emphasised that it would be the happiest moment for him if there will be no more additions in the Martyrs' list next year.

Earlier DGP J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS read out the names of 786 police and central forces personnel who laid down their lives during the last one year while on duty throughout the country amongst whom 49 J&K Police

personnel, 14 CRPF and 13 BSF personnel laid down their lives in Jammu & Kashmir during this period.

While speaking on the occasion, Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K paid rich tributes to the martyrs and highlighted the courage and bravery exhibited by Jammu & Kashmir Police and other police forces in maintaining Law & Order and combating militancy in the state.

The DGP expressed his gratitude to the Chief Minister for his keen interest in developing a police

force which would be capable of dealing difficult situations with professional capability.

Highlighting the welfare measures being adopted by the department for the welfare of families of Police martyrs, the DGP J&K said - equal attention is being paid to the welfare of families of police martyrs — "Over Rs.7.12 crores worth relief has been given to these families during last year besides paying Rs.1.50 crore ex-gratia assistance besides providing 548 jobs to the next of kin of the martyrs", the DGP added.

A similar function was also organized at Jammu on October 21, 2010. Shri Ashok Gupta IPS IGP Jammu Zone, senior police officers including serving and retired police personnel laid the wreaths on the Memorial of Police Martyrs at Rail Head Complex, Jammu. A Blood donation camp was also organized on the occasion in which 46 police personnel donated their blood. Besides, several Jammu based serving and retired senior Police officers, Hon'ble MsLA and family members of Police martyrs were also present on the occasion.
