### STATE NEEDS MORE SACRIFICES - CHIEF MINISTER.

The Chief Minister, Dr. Farooq Abdullah, while paying tributes to Inspector Mushtaq Ahmad Baba and other policemen who sacrificed their lives fighting militants, has said that many more similar sacrifices will be required to clean the State of militancy. Dr. Abdullah was speaking on the concluding function of the 1st. Mushtaq Memorial Football tournament at Srinagar on September 14. The chief Minister while appreciating the role of security forces and J&K Police, who were working in difficult conditions away from their homes, wanted all steps to be taken for their welfare considering the services they are rendering to the country. The Chief Minister also hinted at increase in the reservation quota in professional colleges in the State

for the children of the policemen who were killed in anti-militancy operations. He congratulated J&K Police for organizing the tournament in memory of a valiant officer.

Speaking on the occasion, the Director General of Police, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, ranked J&K Police amongst best forces in the country and said that the day is not far when other states will requisition J&K Police for maintenance of law and order. Shri Jagat said that the State Police cannot forget sacrifices of these personnel and the families of those killed should never feel alone as they

continue to be the honoured members of the large Police family. He advised SHOs, SDPOs and district SsP to make it a point to visit such families in their jurisdiction periodically and solve their problems.

The tournament which began as part of the Police Week celebrations was organized in memory of Late Inspector Mushtaq Ahmad Baba, SHO Police Station Kothibagh, who was killed in an explosion on October 31, 1997 while trying to save precious lives in Srinagar town. The Chairman of the organizing Committee, Dr. Ashok Bhan, IGP Armed Police, gave a brief resume of the tournament in which 13 teams participated and J&K Police won the final, beating BSF by 5 goals to 4 in a match decided by penalty shootouts after the two teams were locked in a 1-1 draw during the stipulated time.

### POLICE WEEK CELEBRATED.

J&K Police for the first time organized a "Police Week" for providing a forum for various ranks to get together and discuss professional and welfare subjects. The week was also aimed at better Police-Public relations and generating ideas for improving performance by exchange of views within the force and with the public at large.

This year's "Police Week" celebrations commenced on September 4 with a seminar on "Challenges before the J&K Police" which



was inaugurated by the DGP, Shri Gurbachan Jagat. In his keynote address, the DGP stressed for an integrated approach between various wings of Police with the help from the public for resolving the current security problems. Papers were presented by Shri P.S. Gill, IGP

Kashmir Zone, on "Anti Militancy operations", Dr. Ashok Bhan, IG Armed Police on "Discipline & Man Management" and Shri R.V. Raju, IGP Crime & Railway on "improving investigating skills". The topics which generated discussions with senior officers, contributed in formulating views on ways and means to tackle these important challenges before the State Police. Addl. DGP CID Shri R. Tikoo and senior officers including district SsP and Commandants of JKAP and IR battalions participated in the seminar.

A function was organized by the Zonal Police in Bemina Police complex to honour the widows of policemen who laid down their lives while fighting militancy. Shri Gurbachan Jagat, handed over to each of the families of martyrs a cheque of Rs 5000/-, one pressure cooker and 2 blankets. Speaking on the occasion, IGP Kashmir Zone, Shri P.S. Gill, outlined various measures being taken for the welfare of martyrs and expressed his gratitude to some prominent citizens who had contributed blankets and pressure cookers.

The State Crime Branch organized a colourful dog show in Srinagar which was well attended. Dogs trained in the state and outside displayed their skills in detecting explosives and narcotics.

Shri A.Q. Manhas, Commandant JKAP VII battalion, compered the programme. Folk items from Ladakh, Kashmir, Jammu and Punjab were widely applauded. A dance item by Miss Shazia daughter of SI Ghulam qadir No 2678/NGO of JKAP VII battalion got thunderous applause.

Shri Gurbachan Jagat, Director General of Police, while speaking at the conclusion of the cultural programme, announced that a Rs 200 Crore action plan had been formulated for strengthening of J&K Police which was likely to be implemented in two years. The DGP said that the operational efficiency of the force was being improved and a new approach of making the entire police force trained to take up anti-militancy operations had started bearing fruits. The DGP praised the role of Armed Police battalions, some of which had now been located in Doda, Poonch, Reasi and Kupwara. Shri Jagat announced a grant of Rs 25 Lacs for improvement in the Zewan Complex including providing of street lights and water. He also announced grant of Rs 10, 000/- out of sports fund for each Armed Police battalion. DGP mixed with the Jawans during *Bara Khana* and talked about their problems. A Tattoo show was organized by the Jawans of IR III under the supervision of Shri Mohmad Amin, Dy. SP IR I.

### **RICH HAUL BY SOG BUDGAM**

In a Major success, SOG Budgam has busted a racket of gun runners by intercepting a bus coming from Kupwara on September 11 and recovering 31 wireless sets, 18 rockets, 2 R1 missiles, 20 remote control devices, 25 KGs of explosives, 49 detonators and 4 AK rifles.

The operation was carried out under the supervision of SP operations Budgam, Shri Ashiq Bukhari and weapons were recovered from an improvised cabin in a bus. Weapons were meant to be distributed through the so called Divisional Commander of HM in Ganderbal for use in Srinagar and Budgam areas.

### **LASHKER-E-TOIBA CHIEF KILLED BY SOG SURANKOTE.**

In an encounter, Lashker-e Toiba Chief Moin Ahmad alias Waseem Akram R/o Lahore was killed. A huge quantity of arms and ammunition was recovered. A fake Indian passport was also found in the possession of the slain militant who had earlier been operating in Punjab and was involved in several bomb blasts in Delhi.

Yet another Pakistan National, Nadeem alias Abu Syeed, a front ranking militant of Tehreek-ul-Mujahideen outfit was killed in a fierce gun battle with police at village Khajra in Poonch district on September 16 and one AK- 47 rifle, three magazines and two grenades were recovered from the possession of the slain militant.
