Day-2006 was observed throughout the state of J&K with the renewed commitment to bring peace and normalcy in the state. The state level function was held in the J&K Armed Police Complex at Zewan, Srinagar. 

Addressing the large gathering, Shi Ghulam Nabi Azad, Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K, said that the reign of terror let loose by the perpetrators of violence, by indulging in killings and massacre of innocent civilians, Police and members of Paramilitary Forces, was not akin with the temperament of the natives of Kashmir. Through their most inhuman and barbaric acts, which included slitting of throats and severing the heads and chopping off the body organs of innocent people in the manner a butcher does a lamb, militants had brought a bad name to Kashmir and its natives. Their acts were in total disregard of the ages old moral traditions and human values, that are still prevalent in Kashmir, the Chief Minister added. Dwelling on the machinations of the terrorists, the Hon'ble Chief Minister said that they were employing all methods to exploit the sentiments of people on fundamental lines but the saner majority of the people had rejected their ideology out rightly. Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad said that the time had come for the gun-wielding youth to shun the path of violence and work for the development and prosperity of the state. "Violence has no role in Kashmir; I vow to usher the state of Jammu and Kashmir to everlasting peace and prosperity with the support of people in general", Hon'ble Chief Minister said.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister paid rich tributes to 584 Police Martyrs of the country, who laid down their lives during the period from September 01, 2005 to August 31, 2006, on the occasion.

Speaking on the occasion, Shri Gopal Sharma, Director General of Police J&K, said that the Police Commemoration Day was observed in memory of Police officers and Jawans who sacrificed their precious lives for fighting terror, protecting the lives and property of the people and keeping the peace. The Director General of Police J&K said the state Police was ever prepared and committed to fight the menace of terrorism and expressed his firm belief in that the complete normalcy and peace will be restored in the state soon. The DGP read out the names of 684 Police Martyrs of the country, who laid down their lives during the period from September 01, 2005 to August 31, 2006, which included 72 officers and Jawans of the state Police.

Later, Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated the 'Blood Donation Camp', organized by J&K Police, in the Armed Police Complex Zewan, to mark the Police Commemoration Day celebrations.

On September 11, 2006, at 1045 pm, aforesaid Girdhari Lal spotted flash-like light emitting out of an abandoned bag near the outer wall of the Chest Disease Hospital, adjacent to the main entrance of Government Medical College, Jammu. The unusual happening aroused suspicion in him and he immediately

informed the patrolling party of Police Station Bakshi Nagar, Jammu about it. The Police swung into action and found a big IED in the bag. The bomb disposal squad neutralized the IED, which contained 7-Kgs RDX fitted with a programmed time device.

The timely information of Shri Girdhari Lal, an active Public Partner's commitment to Peace, enabled Police to neutralize the IED before it could cause unimaginable damage to life and property.

In recognition of the great service rendered, Dr. S.P.Vaid, Inspector General of Police, Jammu Zone handed over a Cash reward of Rs.50, 000/- to Shri Girdhari Lal on September 12, 2006, at a special function organized at Jammu.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr.S.P.Vaid, IGP Jammu Zone lauded the support and cooperation extended to Police by the local people in combating crime and fighting terrorism. Dr.S.P.Vaid announced a cash reward of Rupees one lakh, besides promising to provide government job, to such person/s as would give information to police about the grenade thrower/s, help nabbing terrorist/s lobbying grenades or give tips about fidayeen and other terrorist attacks.

Timely information and cooperation by the public helped Police to avert yet another catastrophe at Daksool on Gool- Sangaldan road on September 26, where the militants had planted an IED fitted with 15-Kg RDX and three grenades to target the convoy.

NUN MOUNTAINEERING EXPEDITION

hree mountaineers, among the 19-member expedition team of J&K Armed Police, while scaling the Himalayan peak of Nun (7,153 m), the highest mountain located in the Suru valley of Ladakh, were caught in heavy snowfall and strong winds, on September 01. The last radio contact with the trio, Mohammad Mussa, Sonam Wangyal and Tsewang Narboo, was established at 2100 hours on September 01when

they were in Camp-II, barely 3-4 hours climbing distance away from the Summit. The strenuous rescue operations launched for over 15 days were of no avail as every ground and aerial effort in the heavy snowbound area failed to get any clue of the presence of three expedition members. They either lay buried in heavy mass of snow or the crevasse, always a possibility in the given circumstances.



At 11 a.m., on Thursday, August 10, the J&K Police's Nun Expedition-2006 began. Shri B.R. Kundal, Financial Commissioner (Home), flagged off 19 mountaineers of J&K Armed Police, amidst a galaxy of senior Police officers including Shri Gopal Sharma, DGP J&K, Shri P.S.Gill, ADGP, Armed J&K, Shri Kuldeep Khoda, ADGP, CID J&K, Shri Madan Lal, ADGP, Security J&K, Dr. Ashok Bhan, Commissioner of Vigilance J&K, Shri Navin Agarwal, IGP, Auxiliary Police, Civil Defence and Home Guards J&K, J.A.Makhdoomi, IGP, Headquarters J&K, Shri S.M.Sahai, IGP, Crime and Railways J&K, Shiekh Owais Ahmad, IGP, Armed, Shri Z.H.Chisti, DIG, Armed Srinagar, Shri Farooq Ahmad, DIG, Central Kashmir Range Srinagar and Commandants of Armed Police battalions.

Three members of the expedition team never returned!

Three valiant mountaineers of the expedition team of J&K Police, in SG.Constable Mohmad Mussa, Constable Sonam Wangyal and Constable Tsewang Narboo, have gone missing. Although their mortal frames are "Presumed Dead", yet the courage, fortitude, self-confidence, high morale, reliance, and determination, which they symbolized, will never die! Given their flair for conquering the toughest peaks and conviction to face storms and unsubstantial air with courage, commitment and zest, they wanted to prove Gary Neptune, the great mountaineer, as wrong, who once said, "Climbing can kill you". Alas, the nature was somewhat unkind to them; perhaps the nature did not will what the mountaineers proposed!

In his valedictory speech, Shri S.M Sahai said that it was the bounden duty of Police to safeguard the life and property of the people and protect their Human Rights. Although extraordinary circumstances demanded extraordinary steps, yet the protection of rights of the civilians was paramount in any situation, the IGP added. Referring to the recent encounter between terrorists and security forces at busy Budshah Chowk, in the heart of Srinagar city, in which seven Police and CRPF personnel lost their lives, Shri S. M.Sahai said that every precaution was taken to ensure that there was no serious collateral damage, which resulted in only a single civilian causality in a long gunbattle. Maintaining self-restraint in a grave situation like that was a clear example of respecting Human Rights of Civilians, The IGP added. He advised the participants to ensure that due care of human dignity was taken during the checking of vehicles and frisking of civilians.

Shri Mushtaq Sadiq, Commandant JKAP-XI, who was the coordinator of the Seminar, delivered the Vote of Thanks.

THE WAR AGAINST TERROR CONTINUES

Srinagar Police thwarted the plans of Hizb-ul-Mujahideen out-fit and averted major tragedies in the valley by busting a module that used mobile phone circuits to trigger chemical explosives and had acquired expertise in bomb making.

rinagar Police arrested four terrorists, identified as Altaf Ahmad Mir alias Mushtag alias Sahil, Khursid Ahmad Shah alias Khalid. Mohammad Amin Badyari alias Imtiyaz and Shabir Ahmad Shah alias Sajjad in the second week of September. It recovered Chemical explosive material, circuit diagrams and electronic gadgets, wireless set, weapons, grenades etc from the four arrested members of the module. The arrested persons were responsible for causing an explosion in a BSF bus near Air Port road, Srinagar and an

attempt to explode a car bomb near Hyderpora, Srinagar on August 08. The module had planned to cause a series of attacks on the bye-pass area of Srinagar but they were arrested before the execution of their plan. Two of the members of the module are still at large and a massive hunt is on to nab them.

Shri S.M.Sahai, IGP Kashmir zone Srinagar, while addressing the media on September 16, said that this was the first known case of terrorists using chemicals and mobile phone circuits for causing bomb explosions.

The seized explosive material (chemicals), electronic gadgets including mobile circuits, circuit detector, chip programmer for remote controlled triggering device and the manual showing circuit diagrams etc were displayed to the media men during the press conference.

Jammu Police eliminated, much to the relief of people living in the areas of Gool, Banihal, Ramban and Mahore, in the districts of Udhampur and Doda, a die-hard terrorist and commander of Hizb-ul-Mujahideen outfit, on September 05. The slain terrorist was involved in countless incidents of terrorist violence including 16 incidents of brutal killings and 10 of attempt to murder, besides number of incidents of loot, abduction and arson.

A die-hard terrorist of Hizb-ul-Mujahideen, identified as Wasim alias Billu Gujjar, a native of Sumber (Ramban), who was active in the districts of Udhampur and Doda for the past 15 years, was eliminated by a Police team of Police District Ramban, in a fierce gun battle at village Malgoi (Gool), on September 05. Shri Randeep Singh, Dy.S.P and Shri Bhushan Manhas, SHO Police Station, Gool (Udhampur) led the operation.

Shri Gopal Sharma, Director General of Police J&K, announced a package of rewards in favour of the team that participated actively

in the operation, immediately after the operation. The Director General of Police visited Ramban Police District on September 09 to felicitate the team members at a special function. He distributed an amount of Rs. 6 lakh amongst the team members and announced out-of-turn promotions to 19 Police personnel and regularization of SPOs as Police constables. Dr. S.P.Vaid, IGP, Jammu Zone, Shri L.T.Mohanti, DIG, Udhampur-Doda Range and Shri Basant Rath, SSP Ramban were present on the occasion.

Some Notable Successes in anti-militancy

- O In a joint operation by Army and Rajouri Police, a cache of weapons and ammunition were recovered from Upper Swari in Rajouri district on September 01. The recovered weapons included 09 AK rifles, a Pika Gun and 06 UBGLs. In two other operations, jointly conducted by Police and CRPF, two hideouts of terrorists were smashed and a large quantity of arms and ammunition including 02 AK rifles, 25 grenades, 09 kgs. RDX and 02 wireless sets were recovered in Mendhar and Mandir Gala forests, the preceding day.
- Doda Police arrested a Lashkar-e-toiba militant, identified as Javeed Sofi @ Nadeem on September 20. He was involved in various terrorist related incidents including the recent grenade attacks in Doda town.
- In a joint operation, Doda Police and Army eliminated three Lashkar-e-toiba terrorists including a Pakistani national, during an encounter that lasted for five hours, in Gandoh area of Doda district on September 19.

Campaign to Nab Wanted Terrorists Intensified

On September 8, 2006, Srinagar Police started a poster campaign for the arrest of two dreaded terrorists, both Pak nationals, who were involved in killings and other terrorist activities in Kashmir valley for quite some time. The posters contained the descriptive roll of the wanted terrorists, besides their sketches. Police promised a Cash Reward of Rs. three lakh to anyone providing information or clues that would lead to the arrest of the two-wanted terrorists.

JAMMU POLICE BUSTS CHAIN SNATCHERS GANG

Jammu Police busted a gang of chain snatchers by arresting all the four members of the gang, who were active for quite some time in the areas of Sarwal, Bakshi Nagar, Subash Nagar and Rehari of Jammu city. Police team led by Shri Arun Kotwal, Incharge Police Post, Sarwal, Jammu, arrested Amit Dogra alias Mitu, Manu Khajuria, Lalli and Shafiq Ahmed and

12 gold chains, valuing at Rs.3.25 Lakhs, were recovered at their instance and disclosure.

SSP, Jammu handed over the recovered property to its owners on September 11, 2006, at a function organized at Jammu.




