C.M ADDRESSES POLICE TRAINEES

Elaborating on the imperatives of "Ideal Policing", Dr. Faroog Abdullah, C.M, J&K, said that justice has to be dispensed to all, irrespective of religious, political and regional considerations, in his address to trainee officers," including 53 Dy. SsP, 35 Prosecuting Officers and 106 Sub Inspectors, all new entrants, at Sher-e-Kashmir Police Academy, Udhampur, on August, 16. Exuding confidence that they shall become the role model for others, Dr. Abdullah gave them a piece of advice- "Police Service, which you chose to join willingly, involves greater responsibilities and obligations. Don't You ever shy from the responsibilities and do your duty till last breath with honour and dignity." "You have to keep up the highest traditions of the force by befriending people and receiving bullets from the front while defending the unity and integrity of the country", the C.M added.

The Chief Minister lauded the role of J&K Police in fighting the Pakistan sponsored militancy in J&K and complemented Shri A.K. Suri, DGP, as also the former DGP, Shri Gurbachan Jagat, for their efforts in reactivating the state police, which has emerged as a force to reckon with. J&K Police, though better equipped than the police in most of the states in the country, needs more logistic support, he added.

Speaking on the occasion, Shri A.K. Suri, DGP, dwelt on the measures being taken for strengthening the police. Recalling the sacrifices made by the J&K Police, he said that 600 officers and jawans have laid down their lives while fighting militants, which has further strengthened our resolve to bring back peace to the state.

Earlier, in his welcome address, Dr. A.K. Bhan,

Director, SKPA, Udhampur, gave a resume of the activities of the Academy and said that stress is being laid on infrastructural development and upgrading training facilities.

Beig, SSP, traffic(NHW), Shri J.L. Sharma, Assistant Director, administration, SKPA and Shri Saji Mohan, Assistant Director, Indoor, SKPA were among those present on the occasion.

ORIENTATION COURSES FOR K.A.S OFFICERS

A week-long orientation course for a batch of 70 K.A.S probationary officers, sponsored by IMPA, was inaugurated by I.S. Malhi, Chief Secretary, J&K, at Sher-e-Kashmir Police Academy, Udhampur, on August, 19. The aim and objective of conducting such courses is:

- To acquaint and introduce the new entrants with the prevailing security scenario in the state, response of the state police to the challenges posed by cross border terrorism;
- To familiarize the young officers with the command structure, hierarchy and functioning of uniformed services; and
- To give them a flavour of camaraderie among uniformed services, who, irrespective of caste and creed, live together and work for achieving the organizational goals.

In his inaugural address, the Chief Secretary elaborated on the essence of 'training' and said that the training was important to infuse and develop better quality and competence among the young officers, which shall provide them an opportunity to gain varied experience in running the administration. While giving them the tips of efficient and effective administration, he stressed on maintaining integrity, remaining physically and mentally sound and healthy, updating the knowledge with day to day advancement in Science and Information Technology and inculcating social and moral values.

Earlier, Dr. A. K. Bhan, Director, SK Police Academy, Udhampur, in his welcome address, said that the young trainee officers shall be appraised of security scenario and response of J&K Police besides providing interaction with uniformed services. A number of demonstrations in 'outdoor' activities and panel discussion on 'Relation between Magistracy and Police' shall be the highlights of the training, Dr. Ashok Bhan added.

Yet another course was inaugurated by Shri Gopal Sharma ADGP, Armed, J&K on August 26.

In his inaugural address, Shri Gopal Sharma dwelt at length on cross border terrorism, machinations of ISI, role of security forces in general and that of J&K Police in particular in combating terrorism and reorganization, expansion and modernization of J&K Police. He also gave a graphic presentation, through computer projection, of militant's violence, successes achieved by security forces and J&K Police in combating terrorism and also the sacrifices made by them.

Shri A.K. Suri, DGP, J&K was the chief guest at the valedictory function, held on August 31.




