CHIEF MINISTER RELEASES SPECIAL ISSUE OF J&K POLICE NEWS LETTER

The Chief Minister Dr Farooq Abdullah released, on August 15, at Bakshi Stadium, Srinagar, a special number of J&K Police News Letter published to mark 50 years of Indian Independence. Conveying his best wishes to the officers and men of J&K Police, the Chief Minister, in his message, gave a call for complete reorientation of the police force to meet one of the toughest challenges facing the Nation in the form of 'proxy war' imposed upon us by disruptionist forces. In the 50th year of independence, he wanted the police to rededicate themselves to protect the integrity of the Country and the honour of our people.

Earlier, Dr Farooq Abdullah unfurled the national flag at Bakshi Stadium and took the salute at an impressive march past led by Shri A.K.Atri, Commandant JKAP 14th Bn. Contingents

of Lady police and NCC cadets from different schools were the highlight of the parade which was followed by a cultural programme of Kashmiri patriotic songs and *Bhangra*.

DR FAROOQ ABDULLAH ADVOCATES PEOPLE FRIENDLY POLICING

The Chief Minister has advised the Police to face with fortitude the challenges faced by the Country and rededicate themselves for maintaining peace and order. He wanted the police force to be people friendly and function as per the law of the land.

Talking to IPS Probationers on August 26, the Chief Minister, urged the young Officers to be vigilant against anti-social elements who were a grave threat to the civilized society. He said the police force has to play a vital role in maintaining order and preserving the unity and integrity of the Country by exposing and taking to task the forces inimical to peace. 40 IPS

probationers, including 5 lady Officers, who are on a 3-month study tour of the Valley, had called on the Chief Minister with whom they had a detailed interaction.

MoS HOME REVIEWS SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS

Shri Ali Mohammad Sagar, MoS (Home), reviewed the security arrangements and overall law and order situation in Jammu province in a meeting held on August 08 in Civil Secretariat, Jammu. MoS (Home) emphasized the need for taking adequate steps throughout Jammu province and particularly in Jammu city because of ongoing Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra and reports of ISI plans to disrupt the independence day celebrations. He praised local police and security forces for the recent recoveries of RDX, arms and ammunition and stressed on the need for increased vigil in Poonch and Rajouri districts. He appreciated the role of Army, BSF, CRPF, J&K Police and Intelligence agencies.

IPS/IFS PROBATIONERS CALL ON THE DGP

40 Indian Police Service Probationers and 20 Indian Foreign Service Probationers called on the DGP Shri Gurbachan Jagat on August 29 and 30, respectively, in Police Headquarters, Srinagar. The Officers were given a brief on the current situation in J&K and measures being taken by J&K Police, in close association with Security and Para Military forces, in fighting the residual militancy.

The DGP said that ultimate success in fighting the militancy has to be achieved by involvement of local police which was better acquainted with topography and has access to information which leads to pinpointed operations. He highlighted the role of STF which had during the past few months eliminated 35-40 top militant leaders with the help of PMFs. The DGP delineated the contemporary challenges of police and said that young officers going to work in the North East will have to arm themselves with capabilities to tackle insurgency, besides

normal policing. The DGP highlighted the importance of good relationship between the State Police Officers and Army/PMFs for achieving better results.

Shri Gopal Sharma, IGP(Hqrs.), gave a video-presentation on developing militancy over the years and the present situation. IGP Kashmir Zone, Shri P.S.Gill traced the background of militancy and narrated the history leading to the present security situation in the State.

SHRI AMARNATH JI YATRA CONCLUDES

J&K Police added another feather to its cap with the successful conclusion of Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra during which about 70,000 pilgrims visited the Holy cave. The Yatra, which was spread over a period of 40 days, involved arrangements at

SOG MAKES MASSIVE ARMS SEIZURES IN VALLEY

SOG Budgam recovered a cache of weapons from a hide out of militants. Kupwara SOG, in a well planned operation in co-ordination with BSF personnel, recovered a large number of

arms and ammunition from Khumriyal. The seizures included 2 sophisticated anti-aircraft guns, 6 rocket boosters, 5 rocket fuses, 3 IEDs, 25 AK Magazines and over 4500 rounds of AK ammunition.

JAMMU POLICE ARRESTS

ASSASSIN OF LATE S.BEANT SINGH

Jammu Police achieved a major success by arresting a dreaded militant of Babar Khalsa International, Paramjeet Singh

Behora, who was responsible for a number of killings and explosions including assassination of former Punjab Chief Minister late S.Beant Singh. He was also responsible for the Pathankot bus bomb blast on June 06. At his instance, police

arrested Nirmal Singh @ Nimma and recovered 3 Kgs. of RDX which were to be used to create disturbance on Independence day. Paramjeet Singh has made startling disclosures about the plans of militants to strike in Punjab and J&K. 74 Kgs. of RDX, 3 AK Rifles, 7 Pistols, 5 Wireless Sets, 20 delayed time Pencil devices, 4 delayed time fuses, 6 remote control devices and 19 detonators were recovered following the arrest of Paramjeet Singh.
