POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY-2012 OBSERVED ACROSS THE STATE

J&K Police observed Police Commemoration Day in all the districts across the State on October 21, 2012 to pay homage to the Police Martyrs and commemorate their memories.

The state level function was held at Police Martyrs Memorial Zewan, Srinagar where Hon'ble Chief Minister J&K Jenab Omar Abdullah took the salute of commemoration day parade and also laid floral wreath on the memorial. The DGP J&K Shri Ashok Prasad IPS read out the names of 574 brave Police Martyrs of the country who sacrificed their precious lives in the alter of duty during the year 2012 and paid rich tributes to them on the occasion. Besides, the Hon'ble Chief Minister also visited the blood donation camp organized on the occasion.

While paying rich tributes to Police Martyrs the Hon'ble Chief Minister lauded the role of Jammu and Kashmir Police and announced the enhancement of ex-gratia assistance for next of kin of Police Martyrs'. The Hon'ble Chief Minister apart from enhancement of ex-gratia assistance, also announced increase in uniform and kit maintenance allowance and two sets of uniforms for traffic police annually, and emphasized that all the proposals put up by the Police Department in this regard have been approved and orders will be issued soon. The Hon'ble Chief Minister added that

the government is determined to provide all necessary help to the families of Police Martyrs. "We are equally bereaved by the loss of your dearest ones and we share your grief", the hon'ble Chief Minister added.

While highlighting the sacrifices of Police Martyrs the Hon'ble Chief Minister said that the Martyrs have given their lives to safeguard the country and ensure security of people.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister emphasized that in the present scenario Police Personnel have to keep a gun in one hand and a stick in the other to deal with different situations. This is a peculiar phenomenon in the State. Despite many difficulties and challenges Jammu and Kashmir Police has proven its mettle earning the status of one of the best Police forces in the country.

Speaking on the occasion Shri Ashok Prasad IPS DGP J&K presented resume of welfare measures taken by the Police Department for families of Police Martyrs. He said that over Rs. 75.50 lakh have been provided to these families as assistance during last year besides ex-gratia relief worth Rs 1.50 crore to next of kins of martyrs of J&K Police.

The DGP said that Rs. 12 lakhs have been provided in the shape of scholarships to 440 children of Martyrs besides providing employment to over 780. The DGP said that the daughters of the Police Martyrs

are being provided Rs. 50,000 for bearing expenses of marriage. He expressed gratitude to the Hon'ble Chief Minister for his keen interest in the welfare of families of Police Martyrs and strengthening of Jammu and Kashmir Police.

He emphasized that the ever growing list of Martyrs from the year 1959 when a small group of brave CRPF soldiers laid down their lives in Leh region facing the Chinese Troops ask us to rededicate ourselves to the cause of the Nation. The Unity and Integrity of our Country comes first and to safe guard the same is the prime duty of Para-Military Forces and the State Police Organizations.

The IGP read out the list of 574 brave Martyrs of the Country and paid rich tributes to them followed by laying of wreaths at Martyrs Memorial.

Among others who were present on the occasion include DisG S/Shri J.P Singh IPS, T. Punchok IPS, Johny William IPS, all COs and Officers from Armed Police Units, SSP Jammu and all Officers from Jammu, Deputy Director IB Jammu, Retired Police Officers S/ Shri Madan Lal IPS, C.L.Banal IPS, Ashok Gupta IPS, Gulzar Singh Slathia IPS, and other officers. The prominent organizations and citizens representing social /Political and religious organizations, Chambers of Commerce also attended the function.

DGP commissioned Model Police Station at Batamaloo

In order to upgrade the building infrastructure and provide better living and working facilities to the personnel Shri Ashok Prasad IPS DGP J&K Commissioned Model Police Station at Batamaloo on September 22, 2012.

While speaking on the occasion, the DGP J&K emphasized that in view of the increasing manpower, the organization has been focusing to upgrade the facilities for its personnel as per the requirements. Constructions are carried out keeping in mind the modern facilities and techniques of construction, the DGP added.

34 Sub-Inspectors of J&K Armed Police Promoted as Inspectors

311 Constables promoted as Sgct

While congratulating the promoted officers, the IGP said that timely promotions boost up the morale of the young officers. He impressed upon the officers to do their duty properly to ensure the security of the common masses of the State.

Murder case of lady worked out, accused arrested

Katra Police solved a mysterious murder case within a short period by arresting the main accused being involved in a day light murder of one lady who fled away after committing the heinous crime. The accused identified as Sham Lal alias Nonu S/O Tirath Lal R/O Bhaktha.

It is revealed that murder accused namely Sham Lal alias Nonu involved in case FIR No. 223/2012 U/S 302/IPC, 4/27 Arms Act at Police Station Katra was arrested at Jhajjar Nallah. He had committed the murder of his real aunt (Tai) namely Pushpa Devi W/O Diwan Chand R/o Bhaktha on 15.09.2012 at about 1230 hours with the blow of sword. The motive behind the murder was family dispute as the accused suspected her aunt Pushpa Devi practiced witchcraft on her mother, who had expired in the month of January this year after brief illness. Family members of the accused had consulted certain persons claiming to have magical powers to counter the alleged witchcraft practice. The accused was extremely convinced by the versions of these persons claiming to have magical powers. After the death of her mother, accused had decided to take the revenge and teach a lesson to Pushpa Devi. On the fateful day i.e. 15.09.2012 Pushpa Devi was talking with her daughter-in-law at her residence. The accused had altercation with Pushpa Devi and in the fit of anger he brought the sword from inside his home which

he had already kept in readiness to commit the crime. Deceased Pushpa Devi in an attempt to save her life, ran from the premises of the house towards the main road but accused chased her and gave the sharp sword blows on her shoulder and neck. People standing nearby on the busy road shifted the injured to the hospital where she was declared brought dead. Accused after committing the crime took lift in a water tanker and after some distance jumped off from the water tanker and managed to slip in the nearby thick vegetation. Police parties headed by ASP Katra, SDPO Katra, SHO Katra and other officers/officials under the supervision of SSP Reasi rushed into different directions to nab the accused on the direction of worthy DIG Udhampur-Reasi Range. The raids on the suspected places and hideouts of the accused were searched. Different suspects including his close friends were picked up for questioning but could not be apprehended. The above Police parties continued the efforts to apprehend the accused. Tremendous pressure was mounted on the accused and Police personal in the civvies were also deployed in the different areas. The accused was spotted at Jhajjar Nallah and weapon of offence on his disclosure was recovered at Chandwa where he had hidden the same in the bushes after committing the crime and before absconding.
